

MINUTES FOR COMMITTEE POST COMMISSION MEETING

APRIL 15, 2016

The Tennessee Peace Officer Standards and Training Commission met on Friday, April 15, 2016, at 9:30 a.m., at the Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy, 3025 Lebanon Road, Nashville, Tennessee.

Chairman Kim Wallace called the meeting to order and entertained a motion for adoption of the agenda. Commissioner Long so moved, seconded by Commissioner Williamson. The motion carried.

There were no administrative matters to be discussed at this time.

Chairman Wallace called for a motion for approval of the Minutes of the March 18, 2016 meeting. Commissioner Williamson moved for approval, seconded by Commissioner Baker. The motion carried.

The chairman recognized Director Ray Farris to conduct roll call, which reflected the presence or absence of the following commissioners: Baker – present; Chrisman – present; Hannon – present; Jenkins – present; Lewis – present; Long – present; Wallace – present; Williamson – present; Wilson – present; Sen. Bell – present; General Cherry – present.

A quorum was noted to be present.

Vice-chair Carl Jenkins read the following disclaimer into the record: All POST Commissioners have previously agreed to recuse themselves from any vote that would constitute a conflict of interest. The most obvious of these would include issues that involve our own departments or someone we know personally. Because we have already agreed to do this, it should be noted that on routine matters, it will be assumed nonverbally that these commissioners have abstained from the vote. In bigger, more controversial issues that may have a more overt conflict of interest or may have an appearance of impropriety, applicable commissioners will still verbally abstain from these votes.

The Informal Hearing Committee did not meet in April.

APPEARING BEFORE THE COMMISSION/ WAIVERS FOR PREEMPLOYMENT REQUIREMENTS – 1110-02-.03 + 1110-9-.04

Blount County Sheriff Office – Andrew Howdeshell – Request a waiver for Officer Howdeshell, for the charges of D.U.I. on October 19, 2003. He has met all of the obligations of the court and his driver license was reinstated in 2005. He has not had any arrests or alcohol related incidents since that arrest in 2003. Sheriff Berrong feels that Mr. Howdeshell has learned from his mistake and request the POST Commission to grant this waiver.

Mr. Howdeshell was present along with Capt. Jeff Bershell requesting the waiver. Capt. Bershell explained Mr. Howdeshell was a young man at the time of the occurrence. He served forty-four hours and completed his probation. Mr. Howdeshell was a baseball standout at ETSU. Since the DUI, Mr. Howdeshell has worked with children and the high school baseball teams and also has worked with mentally challenged children.

Mr. Howdeshell addressed the commission and said he was twenty-two when the DUI occurred.

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Hannon. Commissioner Jenkins told Mr. Howdeshell to not get another DUI and he is being given a second chance. The motion carried.

Germantown Police Department - Alfred Elias Gabriel, Jr. – Request a waiver for Reserve Officer Gabriel, for the charges of DWI on March 23, 1986. He has met all of the obligations of the court, and his driver's license was reinstated on May 21, 1987. He has not had any arrests or alcohol related incidents since that arrest in 1986. Deputy Gabriel began reserve status with the department on September 3, 2002. His actions since that arrest and his history while working with the Germantown Police Department have proven to us that he is of sound moral character and judgment. We request that the POST Commission grant this waiver so that Alfred E. Gabriel Jr. can continue to serve the citizens of Germantown in his capacity as a Reserve Police Officer.

Mr. Gabriel was present along with Lt. Robert Jones requesting the waiver. Mr. Gabriel told the commission he was twenty-one when he received the DUI and is now fifty-one. He added he no longer consumes alcohol.

Sen. Bell moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Chrisman. The motion carried.

Greene County Sheriff's Office – Ricky Lee Finkle – Mr. Finkle is currently employed at the jail and the department respectfully requests a pre-employment waiver in order to promote Mr. Finkle to a full time court officer. On February 17, 1991 Mr. Finkle was charged with Public Intoxication, he pled guilty and paid the fine. On August 15, 1992 in Greene County TN, Mr. Finkle plead guilty to a DUI, he was sentenced to 48 hours in jail and fines.

Mr. Finkle was present with Chief Deputy Ray Allen requesting the waiver. Mr. Finkle told the commission he was twenty-seven at the time of the DUI. Deputy Allen added Mr. Finkle has been an employee of the sheriff's department for approximately thirteen years working as a corrections officer and was recently reassigned to courthouse security.

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Wilson. The motion carried with Commissioner Hannon abstaining.

Tellico Plains Police Department – Gregory Newman - Mr. Newman was charged with D.U.I. and Open container. He plead guilty to D.U.I and the Open Container Law violation was dismissed. He was convicted and has met all state required penalties of this situation. This offense happened on January 16, 2014. His license was revoked from March 7, 2014 until March 7, 2015. He now has a valid driver's license in the State of Tennessee. This is the third (3rd) request from the department. Supporting documentation has not been forwarded to the P.O.S.T. Commission Office for review.

Mr. Newman was present along with Chief Parks requesting the waiver. Chief Parks explained Mr. Newman has served many years at Sweetwater PD and obtained the rank of captain and then went to work for the Parks & Recreation Department and remained part-time with Sweetwater City until 1/16/14, the date of the occurrence. The Tellico Plains PD feels Mr. Newman has much knowledge from his years of experience and is requesting a waiver to make Mr. Newman part-time.

Commissioner Jenkins asked if any documentation has been received concerning this matter. Director Farris told the chief POST likes to see the court records with the dates and the disposition, which they have not received. Director Farris noted the information has been asked for on a couple of occasions and since it has not been received, the commission has denied the request on two occasions prior to today. Commissioner Jenkins noted also the conviction is only two years old. Director Farris added one denial was due to a failure to appear. Chief Parks noted Mr. Newman's full-time job did not allow him to be present. Commissioner Baker asked the chief if he has copies of the court records showing the disposition of the matter. Chief Parks answered he did not have the documentation but could get it to POST.

Commissioner Wilson said he would recommend denying the request until they are able to see the court documentation and added a year is too soon. Commissioner Williamson asked the chief why he is not able to get the documentation. Chief Parks answered he just did not have the records with him. Director Farris reiterated that the records have been asked for twice previously and the records are generally attached to a waiver request.

Commissioner Williamson moved to deny the request, seconded by Commissioner Chrisman.

Inv. Murphy asked the chief why he has not supplied the records. Chief Parks answered he was not aware he needed to get the records. Mr. Grisham noted Director Farris has sent two letters to the police department stating POST has not received supporting documentation. Director Farris added also Ms. Roberts, a POST Investigator, had sent the chief an e-mail stating the records are needed.

On further discussion, General Cherry mentioned that one of the concerns is not having the records but also noted the DUI charge is a fairly recent occurrence. He added when POST sends people out to be police officers, they are

expected to maintain a particular standard and requirements, character and conduct. General Cherry said he would like some reassurance, in light of this recent event, that whatever the circumstances were, they have been resolved and Mr. Newman can go forward and maintain the standards that are expected of law enforcement officers.

Mr. Newman replied he did make mistake and there is no excuse as far as what he did and accepts full responsibility. He said he would never do it again and that is the only assurance he can offer. General Cherry asked Mr. Newman if there were any issues or circumstances going on in his life at the time that triggered the event. He noted Mr. Newman served honorably for a long time before this happened. Mr. Newman answered there was no triggering event. He said he went to class in Knoxville that night and a friend asked him to go to Aubrey's in Cleveland and he went. He said he had too much to drink and made a bad judgment call to drive. General Cherry asked Mr. Newman what efforts he has made since the incident to correct his drinking problem to avoid this occurring. Mr. Newman answered he does not have a drinking problem as far as drinking every every. He added he has learned everyone is accountable for their own actions. Mr. Newman said he had to resign his position with the government of Sweetwater and also had to step down from other positions. He agreed that police officers do have a certain standard they must withhold and he violated that, but after two years he feels he wants back in law enforcement after many years in it. Mr. Newman said he has advanced his education in law enforcement and feels he can be a help to future police officers in letting them know how quickly their lives can change by making a bad choice.

General Cherry asked Mr. Newman if he recalls what his BAC was. Mr. Newman remarked he did not recall but did not think it was exceptionally high. He said he did not drink a lot that night but said he knew he would plead guilty. The trooper was professional and did a good job. Commissioner Jenkins asked Mr. Newman what options Sweetwater PD gave him after getting the DUI. Mr. Newman answered at that particular time, he was director of Parks & Recreation. At that time, a good friend of his was the supervisor. Instead of placing his friend and supervisor in a difficult position as far as deciding to retain Mr. Newman as director, Mr. Newman made the decision to resign voluntarily.

Commissioner Williamson called for the question.

The motion to deny the request carried.

Chief Parks remarked he would have the required paperwork to POST by the following week.

WAIVER OF BASIC TRAINING – 1110-02-.03 + 1110-9-.02

The following requests for Waiver/Substitution of Basic Training have been reviewed and appear to meet POST requirements:

Collierville Police Department - Travis Lee Patterson - Requests Officer Patterson to attend the POST Transition School September 25 -October 13, 2016. He was hired on March 1, 2016 with the department. Officer Patterson was employed by the Mississippi's Gaming Commission from January, 2011 through September, 2014. During that time Officer Patterson attended the Basic Police School at the Delta State Community College and graduated on October 12, 2011 with 480 hours. A waiver of the 6 month rule is also requested.

Commissioner Jenkins moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Baker. The motion carried.

Madison County Sheriff's Office – Lance Daniel Ferguson - Request that Deputy Ferguson to attend the POST Transition School September 25 - October 13, 2016 and receive a six month waiver. He began employment with the department on April 1, 2016. Deputy Ferguson is California POST certified in 2006 with 814.5 hours of instruction. He was employed at the Kern County Sheriff's Department in Bakersfield, California, from July, 2006 through March, 2009. Deputy Ferguson was also employed at the Mariposa County Sheriff's Department in California, from March, 2009 through April, 2014.

Mr. Ferguson was present along with Sheriff John Mehr requesting the waiver to allow Mr. Ferguson to attend the transition school.

Commissioner Williamson moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Long. The motion carried.

Manchester Police Department – Brandon Daniel Tomberlin - Request Officer Tomberlin to attend the POST Transition School September 25 -October 13, 2016. Officer Tomberlin completed TLETA Basic Police School June 18, 1998. He worked for Manchester Police Department from February 16, 1998 to November 24, 2006. It is also being requested that after he completes a minimum six week FTO program with a certified FTO that he may work solo on patrol until he attends the POST Transition School in September. There will also be a shift captain and shift sergeant on the shift to oversee his duties. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Baker moved to approve the six-month waiver, seconded by Commissioner Lewis. Mr. Underwood asked if the motion includes the ride alone request and to attend the transition school. Commissioner Baker amended the motion to approve the six-month waiver, attend transition school and to deny the ride alone request. Commissioner Jenkins seconded. The motion carried.

T.S.U. Campus Police Department – Brian Brynes - Request Officer Brynes to attend the next POST Transition School. Officer Brynes became employed with the department on December 15, 2015. He is currently POST Certified from the state of Maryland with 864 hours from Eastern Shore Criminal Justice Academy, has worked for an array of other Police agencies including; Ocean City Police, MD. May, 2000-July, 2001; Salisbury Police Dept., MD, July, 2001- July, 2004; Princess Anne Police, MD, July, 2004 – May, 2005; and Crisfield Police, MD, Feb., 2007 – Nov., 2008. Requesting a six-month waiver as well.

Mr. Brynes was present along with Commander Thomas Jackson and Corporal Allen Tatum, Training Officer, making the requests. Mr. Grisham told the commission Mr. Brynes was prepared to go to the transition school which graduated the prior day, however, the psychologist passed away unexpectedly, thereby delaying the preemployment package.

Commissioner Wilson asked Mr. Brynes where he has been from November 2008. Mr. Brynes answered he was in the U. S. Army for two years and then also worked for the TN Department of Correction under Special Operations before going to TSU. Mr. Grisham noted Mr. Brynes has some recent POST service while he worked with the Department of Correction.

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve, seconded by Sen. Bell. The motion carried.

Commissioner Chrisman moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Williamson. The motion carried.

SPECIALIZED TRAINING CURRICULUM – 1110-04-09

POST Investigators have reviewed and approved 57 specialized classes this month as they appear to be in order and meet or exceed minimum standards set forth by the Peace Officers Standards and Training requirements. They have made note if these training offerings meet the POST requirements for Firearms, EVOC, Mental Illness and CSA.

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Baker. The motion carried.

There was no old business for discussion.

NEW BUSINESS/ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION

1. The 2015 Annual Report from The **Memphis Police Department Police Training Academy** was submitted to POST and is compliant with 1110-07-.06 (2)(a).

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Baker. The motion carried.

2. The 2016 audit/inspection of The **Walter State Regional Training Academy** was conducted on February 01, 2016. Due to a significant number of record keeping infractions they were put on notice and re-audited on March 16, 2016. The following are the findings of the March 16 audit/inspection.

Findings: 1. Of the current basic cadet class seven (7) files were incomplete; mainly the fingerprint reports were missing. They rectified numerous ones and were going to fingerprint the cadets themselves in order to get compliant without relying on the departments. 2. Two (2) cadets were incomplete; missing military discharge records as required by POST. One (1) file was rectified during the visit.

Recommendations: I met with the new director, Director Jeff Gazzo and relayed to him the requirement of all pre-employment qualifications must be met prior for every cadet, to starting a basic cadet class. He indicated that he fully understood and this would not happen in the future.

Pursuant to Rule 1110-07-.06 (2)(c) it is recommended the POST Commission issue a letter advising the Walter State Regional Law Enforcement Training Academy of the status of its **Compliance**.

Director Farris commented Walter State Regional Training Academy has recordkeeping issues. There were two audits performed. The second audit revealed there were seven incomplete cadet files, mainly the fingerprint reports missing. Two cadets still had their military discharge documentation missing. However, one cadet did rectify the problem immediately. Director Jeff Gazzo was the assistant director under Caesar Gracia and is now the current director. Director Farris said Director Gazzo assured him these issues would not happen in the future.

Commissioner Jenkins commented he has been on this POST Commission for a few years and Walter State has had problems since he has been on the commission. The commissioner added Walter State knows the rules, however, they submit requests for waivers consistently late. Commissioner Williamson remarked he gets the feeling Walter State feels the POST Commission is not going to do anything, so they keep doing it. Director Farris replied he

feels the director did take the visit seriously and did dismiss one candidate based on something they found out and should have known prior to the cadet beginning the academy. Commissioner Wilson noted there have been problems with Walter State submitting waiver requests when the cadets are halfway through the program.

Chairman Wallace commented it is being recommended that Walter State be sent a letter of compliance. The director said that is his recommendation based on the files being completed. Director Farris said men and women are beginning to be trained in techniques, tactics and law of police work, and POST does not know where these people have come from or what their background is. Many times, sensitive information is being shared with them prior to knowing whether they meet the standards to be in law enforcement in Tennessee. The current class is the largest class Walter State has had, which could be due to the high turnover in law enforcement and also TLETA is full and has a waiting list. Departments are looking at alternatives. There were fifty cadets who started the current class at Walter State.

Director Farris said he can only compare Walter State to Cleveland State, and Cleveland State runs a tight ship and will not ask for waivers. The only finding against Cleveland State was the cadets commingling with civilian students. The vice president was called in and within forty-eight hours, Cleveland State had re-locked down part of the building and made not accessible to the general population of college students.

Commissioner Hannon remarked the standards should be the same state-wide and should not vary. Commissioner Wilson asked how many do-overs will they give Walter State before something is done. Commissioner Lewis asked if the POST Commission can put Walter State on probation. Director Farris answered there are several options available.. He noted that many of the students pay their own money to attend the training academy and would hate not to give those cadets their certifications as he feels it is not their fault. Commissioner Lewis noted that several of their cadets appear before the commission after they have graduated and get raked over the coals because the academy did not ask for the wavier beforehand. Commissioner Lewis added it is disturbing to him that the audit comes back with this kind of finding. Commissioner Jenkins asked when the next class begins at Walter State. Director Farris said he would have to determine the start date.

Commissioner Williamson stated he would hate to punish the new director for something he has had nothing to do with. He asked if they could wait and see what Director Gazzo will do. Director Farris answered Director Gazzo has been at the academy as assistant director and interim director and is not new to the operation, however, he has not been the director. Commissioner Williamson replied the director has been there long enough to know the rules. Mr. Grisham remarked there have been fewer incidences of them coming to the commission and needing a waiver, but POST does not know how bad the paperwork has been because POST has not been able to audit in the last several years. He said personnel has been reassigned over to POST at the hardship of the training academy.

Commissioner Long moved to send a letter to Walter State Training Academy placing them on a two-year probationary period, citing the numerous infractions through the years; adding if there are other problems within the two-year period. POST will request that Walter State's authority to be a training academy be suspended. Commissioner Wilson seconded.

Sen. Bell noted Walter State is a Board of Regents school and asked if the training academy comes under the authority of the school or is it separate. Mr. Grisham answered they are under the authority of the school. The ability to run an academy is through the approval of the POST Commission. Enrollment standards have to be met. If a student is dismissed from the Walter State Training Academy, they have more rights than a student would have at TLETA. Mr. Underwood explained it is a dual program because the student is getting their certification and also their degree. Commissioner Chrisman asked if the letter would also go to the college president as well. Director Farris answered he feels the letter would need to go to the college president. Mr. Underwood remarked this is also something the Rules Committee can look at to see if there is something they want to change or clarify.

Commissioner Lewis asked Director Farris to let Director Gazzo know that the POST Commission is really getting annoyed by what is going on at Walter State. Director Farris remarked he tried to be as frank with Director Gazzo as he could be and told him he was given thirty days before the second audit. He added he also told Director Gazzo that his job is to make the school better but Director Gazzo also has to do his job and that the matter was going on the agenda and the infractions need to stop. The commission agreed they have been accommodating to Walter

State long enough. Mr. Underwood remarked that other POST Commissions through the years have expressed their unhappiness with the situation.

Mr. Grisham replied that unfortunately, the state has to have these other academies because the State is not giving TLETA the facility he needs and cannot train everybody.

Commissioner Wilson asked if the other academies have had this number of infractions. Director Farris answered the other academies do not have this number of infractions. He explained every now and then he will see if somebody transfers to a big academy like Metro and they have not applied for their general basic police certificate. He said this is not a big deal. With Cleveland State, their biggest problem was the commingling with college students and that was taken care of immediately. Most of the time it is small infractions. Mr. Grisham added they generally do not have problems with the departmental academies. He commented that Cleveland State is performing at a high mark currently but they have had their issues in the past at times.

Commissioner Chrisman asked Director Farris if the letter to the academy would have the language that failure to meet the requirements during this probationary period would result in the decertification of their program. Director Farris acknowledged this would be the language contained in the letter. General Cherry commented the commission will have to be prepared to decertify the academy if they do not hold up.

Commissioner Jenkins called for the question.

The motion carried.

The 2016 audit/inspection of The **Chattanooga Police Department Training Academy** was conducted on February 03, 2016.

Findings: 1. One academy instructor file was missing the required General Instructor Certification for Basic Police training.

Recommendations: 1. The file was rectified during the visit.

Pursuant to Rule 1110-07-.06 (2)(c) it is recommended the POST Commission issue a letter advising the Chattanooga Police Department Training Academy of the status of its **Compliance**.

Commissioner Chrisman moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Williamson. The motion carried.

Cheatham County Sheriff's Office Request James Anthony Bertinotti who was hired on October 15, 2015. This officer did start the police academy at Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy on January 10, 2016, but was injured during physical training and was out for healing until the next class that started April 3, 2016, and now has returned to the academy to finish his training. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Williamson. The motion carried.

Crockett County Sheriff's Office Request Jonathon David Deason to be able to attend the Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy. Deputy Deason was hired with the department on November 5, 2015. He has been scheduled to attend the Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy Class which will begin on April 3, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Jenkins. The motion carried.

Dunlap Police Department Request Benjamin Samuel Hayne to attend the Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy with a 6 month waiver. Officer Hayne began employment on December 14, 2015 and is currently in the basic class which will graduate on June 24, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Jenkins moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Baker. The motion carried.

Dyersburg Police Department Request Kevan Rodreagious Ward who was hired on March 7, 2016 and he will not complete the academy until after the 6 months have expired. He is scheduled to be accepted into the July basic class at TLETA. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Baker moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Chrisman. The motion carried with Commissioner Williamson abstaining.

Gibson County Sheriff's Office Request Christopher William Thomas to be granted a 6 month waiver. Deputy Thomas began employment with the department on December 7, 2015 and is currently in the TLETA basic to graduate on June 24, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Hannon. The motion carried.

Hamilton County Sheriff's Office Request Harold Alexander Spletzer to be granted a 6 month waiver. Deputy Spletzer was hired on November 11, 2015 and was unable to get into the January 2016 TLETA Class. He is currently attending the April TLETA Basic Class and will not graduate until June 24, 2016. The department is requesting to be granted a six month waiver to keep Deputy Spletzer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Baker moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Chrisman. The motion carried.

Mr. Grisham noted the next two individuals from Hamilton County Sheriff's Office are the same as the above request and all three individuals are currently in TLETA.

Hamilton County Sheriff's Office Request Marc Edward Stockman to be granted a 6 month waiver. Deputy Stockman was hired on November 11, 2015 and was unable to get into the January 2016 TLETA Class. He is currently attending the April TLETA Basic Class and will not graduate until June 24, 2016. The department is requesting to be granted a six month waiver to keep Deputy Stockman and the department in compliance.

Hamilton County Sheriff's Office Request Aaron Dion Yeargan to be granted a 6 month waiver. Deputy Yeargan was hired on November 11, 2015 and was unable to into the January 2016 TLETA Class. He is currently attending the April TLETA Basic Class and will not graduate until June 24, 2016. The department is requesting to be granted a six month waiver to keep Deputy Yeargan and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Chrisman moved to approve the two above requests, seconded Commissioner Williamson. The motion carried.

Jackson Police Department Request Taylor Anne Phillips to be granted a 6 month waiver. Officer Phillips was hired on November 30, 2015 and began Basic Police School training at TLETA on January 10, 2016; however during week 5 of training suffered an injury. As a result of this injury, Officer Phillips could not physically continue, and had to suspend her academy training. We plan to have her return to complete the academy in week 5 of the Basic Police School class beginning July 10, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Williamson. The motion carried.

Lauderdale County Sheriff's Office Request Cody Ian Davis to be granted a 6 month wavier. Deputy Davis began employment on March 1, 2016 and is to attend the upcoming TLETA basic beginning July 10 with graduation on September 30, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Baker moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Jenkins, which motion carried.

Mr. Grisham noted the next three items from LaVergne Police Department are requesting waivers of the six-month rule and all will begin TLETA in the July class, graduating in September.

LaVergne Police Department Request Thomas Payne Gray, II to be granted a 6 month wavier. Officer Gray was hired March 15, 2016 and will begin basic at TLETA on July 10 with graduation on September 30, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

LaVergne Police Department Request Jeb Davidson Sloan to be granted a 6 month wavier. Officer Sloan was hired March 15, 2016 and will begin basic at TLETA on July 10 with graduation on September 30, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

LaVergne Police Department Request David Antonio Vega Maymi to be granted a 6 month wavier. Officer Vega Maymi was hired March 15, 2016 and will begin basic at TLETA on July 10 with graduation on September 30, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve the above three items, seconded by Sen. Bell. The motion carried.

McMinnville Police Department Request Officer Andres Eduardo Aguilar who was hired by the McMinnville Police Department on December 14, 2015 and is enrolled in this basic class at Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy, April 3rd through June 24th. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Jenkins moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Baker. The motion carried.

Mr. Grisham noted the next two individuals are currently enrolled in TLETA.

Perry County Sheriff's Office Request William Martin McClain to be granted a waiver of the 6 month rule. Officer McClain was hired November 17, 2015 and is currently enrolled in the Basic Police School at the Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy which began on April 3, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Perry County Sheriff's Office Request Forrest Vaughn White to be granted a waiver of the 6 month rule. Deputy White was hired November 3, 2015 and is currently enrolled in the Basic Police School at the Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy which began on April 3, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Chrisman. The motion carried.

Deputy Dement was employed by the department December 7, 2015 and is currently enrolled in the Basic Police School at TLETA graduating June 24, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Rutherford County Sheriff's Office Request William Neal Travis a waiver of the 6 month rule. Deputy Travis was employed by the department December 7, 2015 and is currently enrolled in the Basic Police School at TLETA graduating June 24, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Chrisman moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Baker. The motion carried.

Smith County Sheriff's Office Requests Kendra Lashae Grisham a waiver of the 6 month rule. Deputy Grisham was hired December 14, 2015 and is attending the academy April 03 thru June 24, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Hannon moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Lewis. The motion carried.

Mr. Grisham noted the next two individuals are currently enrolled at TLETA.

Smyrna Police Department Request Danielle Grace Dixon a waiver of the 6 month rule. Officer Dixon was hired on December 7, 2015 and is currently attending TLETA's Basic Police School April 3-June 24, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Smyrna Police Department Request Dustin Calhoun Young a waiver of the 6 month rule. Officer Young was hired on December 7, 2015 and is currently attending TLETA's Basic Police School April 3-June 24, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Wilson. The motion carried.

T.S.U. Campus Police Department Request Ashley Lita Boleyjack a waiver of the 6 month rule. Officer Boleyjack was hired December 23, 2015 and is to be enrolled in the Basic Class starting July 10 - September 30, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Williamson moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Wilson. The motion carried.

Vanderbilt University Campus Police Department Request Joshua Titigon Mailey a waiver of the 6 month rule. He was hired as a community Service Officer at Vanderbilt University Police Department on September 29, 2014. He was promoted to the rank of Police Officer on November 8, 2015. He began the police academy at Walter State Community College on February 1, 2016. On February 29, 2016 Joshua became ill and had to miss that week of the academy courses. He will be rescheduled to make up the curriculum he missed, and at that point receive his graduation certificate. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Sen. Bell moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Chrisman. The motion carried.

Williamson County Sheriff's Office Request Kyle David O'Neal a waiver of the 6 month rule. Deputy O'Neal date of employment was January 10, 2016. He was injured while attending Basic Police School at the Tennessee Law Enforcement Training Academy in January of this year. Due to his injury he was unable to complete and has been rescheduled to complete his basic training coming in on week four of the next class, on April 24, 2016. The department is requesting a waiver of the six month rule to keep the officer and the department in compliance.

Commissioner Baker moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Wilson. The motion carried with Commissioner Long abstaining.

WAIVER OF IN-SERVICE – RULE 1110-09-.05

Requests for a waiver have been received for the following officers so that they will remain in compliance with POST guidelines as well as the department.

Johnson County Sheriff's Office - Request a waiver of 2015 In-service for Mark Joe Greer and Jessie Carl Hatley, these two officers were only employed for this Agency for a period of 3 months in 2015, this employment ended for Deputy Greer in January of 2016, he had no other employment that would satisfy the In-Service. As to Deputy Hatley, he was re-hired by this Agency in 2015 and is currently employed, however due to the limited amount of time in 2015, Deputy Hatley failed to get the 40 Hours, and neither of these persons was employed for 8 months in 2015. This is a Request of Waiver for 2015 In-Service, in order to keep this agency in compliance with POST rules.

Commissioner Jenkins moved for approval, seconded by Commissioner Baker. The motion carried with Commissioner Hannon abstaining.

Lawrenceburg Police Department - Requesting a waiver of in-service training for Shayne Adams for 2015. Shayne attended 32 hours of in-service training through Columbia State Community College and completed all mandatory classes except for E.V.O.C.. He was required by the chief to return to his department for another training class, causing him to miss 8 hours of training. He then completed the required 2 hours E.V.O.C. class thru the Lawrence Co. sheriff's department at a later date, which gave him 34 total hours of in-service training for 2015. We request that these hours be accepted for his completing in-service training for 2015 and he is eligible to receive his salary supplement.

Commissioner Jenkins moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Williamson. The motion carried.

Lincoln County Sheriff's Office - Requests a waiver for the 40 hour in service requirement for the following officers 2015 years training, with explanation: Jarrod Barrow, Michael Claiborne & Thomas Sanders each had 38 of 40 hours, each had all mandatory topics, and each lacked two hours due to an oversight. We request a waiver of the POST 40 hour requirement for these three officers, and ask that they receive the 2015 supplemental pay.

Commissioner Jenkins moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Baker. The motion carried.

Metro Knoxville Airport Public Safety Department is requesting a waiver of In-Service for 2015 (for the second year in a row) for Officer Stephen Vincent Parks so that the department will remain in compliance. Mr. Grisham answered Mr. Parks is suspended from the department, so he will not be allowed to do in-service with the department.

Commissioner Jenkins moved to approve the department's request in order to keep the department in compliance. Commissioner Chrisman seconded.

Director Farris noted that paperwork has been sent in by the department each year reflecting Mr. Parks is in suspended status. Mr. Underwood said upon the conclusion of the investigation, the officer may appeal the termination and may be reinstated. POST is aware of the situation. Commissioner Long clarified that the motion is to grant the waiver to keep the department in compliance but is not waiving the in-service for the officer. Commissioner Jenkins affirmed that is the motion. Mr. Underwood explained if the officer is reinstated, he will have to make up the hours he has missed

The motion carried.

Rockwood Police Department Request a one hour waiver of in-service training for the six officers listed below. Each of the officers completed all statutorily required in-service training for 2015. However, reviewing our records on January 12, 2016 for the salary supplement, we discovered these 6 officers were one hour short of the required annual 40 hours of in-service. This was an error on our part and was not discovered until January 12, 2016. These officers completed Professionalism and Ethics class through the V-Academy which we thought was P.O.S.T. certified for police officers but it is not a POST certified class.

Director Farris answered he does not know and if the academy does not send the information, then POST would not know. He said there are about 66 to 68 different classes that POST approved last month. He added that generally, their management classes are approved.

Commissioner Jenkins stated the request says the officers have 39 hours and he is thinking that is minus the V-Academy.

Commissioner Jenkins moved to approve, seconded by Commissioner Williamson. The motion carried.

WAIVERS FOR MILITARY LEAVE – RULE 1110-09-.06(5)

The following departments are requesting a waiver for military service for the 2015 calendar. Military orders are included along with change of status. These officers will be eligible to receive salary supplement.

Commissioner Lewis moved to approve the two Administrative Waivers Sections, seconded by Commissioner Baker. The motion carried.

Mr. Grisham addressed the commission concerning his recent trip to the Virgin Islands to attend IADLEST Convention. He explained the American Virgin Islands are under a consent decree and are a protector to the United States. Their command staff has attended the National Academy or Glynco or the equivalent. There are 900 officers on two islands. Seven hundred officers are members of the Virgin Islands Police Department. There are some odd 200 plus officers that would be equivalent to wildlife officers and park rangers. Virgin Islands are starting a POST Commission and has two academies. Mr. Grisham said it was fortuitous that he was picked to go the convention. Their POST Commission is organized the same as Tennessee's. Five staff members keep up with the 900 officers.

Mr. Grisham explained there are two academies, one on each of the major islands. There is always a Basic class of twenty-three officers. Forty-six officers start the class every six months. About halfway through each six-month academy, twenty-six of those officers are let go because of background check violations. Mr. Grisham said in talking to their new POST Commission, he told them that his POST Commission would come unglued if background checks could not be accomplished in advance. Mr. Grisham added it was interesting to see how similar their commission was and how different it was. He said they have the same issues. There are people who cannot do push-ups. They do have a week of report writing, which TLETA does not have the luxury of having. The U.S. Attorney is their legal counsel representative on the commission and everything is at the federal level. Mr. Grisham added they are joining IADLEST and it was very interesting to see them work through their issues.

Director Farris said he expects to have an Informal Hearing Committee meeting on Thursday, May 19th with the regular POST Commission meeting on Friday, May 20th.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.


