

According to the THEC policy, all new programs are evaluated annually based on goals established in the proposal. THEC staff recently completed a review of over 100 programs in the Post Approval Monitoring (PAM) cycle. These programs were within the first three to five years of implementation based upon degree level. Of the reviewed programs, 57 achieved the projected benchmarks (or performed above the low-producing threshold of 10 graduates for bachelor's degrees and below, 5 for masters and 3 for doctorate), 32 programs did not meet benchmarks, 8 were delayed, and 2 were terminated.

During the current economic condition, prudence must be exercised when adding new programs as well as in reviewing existing programs and determining the best course of action. When reviewing the programs, some patterns related to productivity emerged. First, numerous programs have been delayed in this cycle and past monitoring cycles. Some programs have been delayed for several years past approval and the projected implementation date. Three Tennessee Board of Regents programs in the current PAM cycle have been delayed numerous times. THEC recommends reviewing these programs for sustainability and possible termination. The programs are a B.S. in Urban Studies at Tennessee State University, an AAS in Occupational Therapy Assistant at Jackson State Community College, and an AAS Histotechnology at Volunteer State Community College.

The second issue relates to implementing the same program throughout the system. An AST in teaching was approved for all 13 community colleges in January of 2006. Nine of the institutions have failed to meet benchmarks or the low-producing threshold for this program. Program productivity plans and comments provided by the institutions indicate a lack of need for the program due to existing programs, market demands in the area, and other factors. Past programs approved for all community colleges have also struggled.

Attached is the PAM status report to be submitted to the Commission at the quarterly meeting. The report gives a brief introduction of PAM and lists the programs in the current cycle based upon productivity. Also, attached you will find an Excel workbook detailing the PAM reports and Program Productivity Plans submitted by the

institutions. A status report is given for each program with recommendations for future reporting requirements. Highlighted programs will be required to submit a Program Productivity Plan in the next PAM cycle. The final pages contain a list of programs that have completed the PAM cycle and new programs that will be added to PAM in the 2008-09 year.

**BACKGROUND INFORMATION:** In accordance with the academic standards adopted by the Commission in 2002, new academic programs approved by the Commission must be monitored following their initial approval. Programs remain in the monitoring cycle for five years at the baccalaureate level and above and three years for pre-baccalaureate programs following approval. All programs in this report were approved on or before July 2007.

At the January commission meeting of each year, staff provides the Post Approval Monitoring Reports for programs that are within the three or five year monitoring cycle. The criteria for reviewing programs are based on goals established in the approved program proposal. The goals include, but are not limited to enrollment and graduation ratios, program cost, progress toward accreditation, library acquisitions, and other goals set by the institution and agreed upon by the governing boards and Commission staff. Program enrollment and graduate data are analyzed based on annual figures. Due to the annual cycle, the programs listed in this report may be in the first year through fifth year of implementation.

If deficiencies are noted during the monitoring cycle, THEC requests information to explain the deficiencies and specific plans for corrective action or recommends programs for termination. Staff also may choose to extend the monitoring period, if additional time is needed and requested by the governing board.

There are various reasons why programs may not meet projected benchmarks. The implementation of programs can be delayed due to difficulty of hiring faculty, inadequate recruitment practices, changes in labor market demands, or other issues not within the control of the institution. Institutions are therefore required to submit Program Productivity Plans to indicate the strategies and plans for correcting deficiencies, plans for termination, or to request an extension of time in the monitoring period.

For the 2007-08 Post Approval Monitoring cycle, over 100 programs were reviewed in this cycle. Of the programs reviewed, 57 programs achieved their projected benchmarks (or performed above the low-producing threshold) and 32 academic programs did not meet their projections. Eight programs were delayed for implementation for various reasons. Finally, two certificate programs were terminated by the governing board. Please refer to Attachment A for listing of academic programs in the 2007-08 monitoring cycle by program action.
