

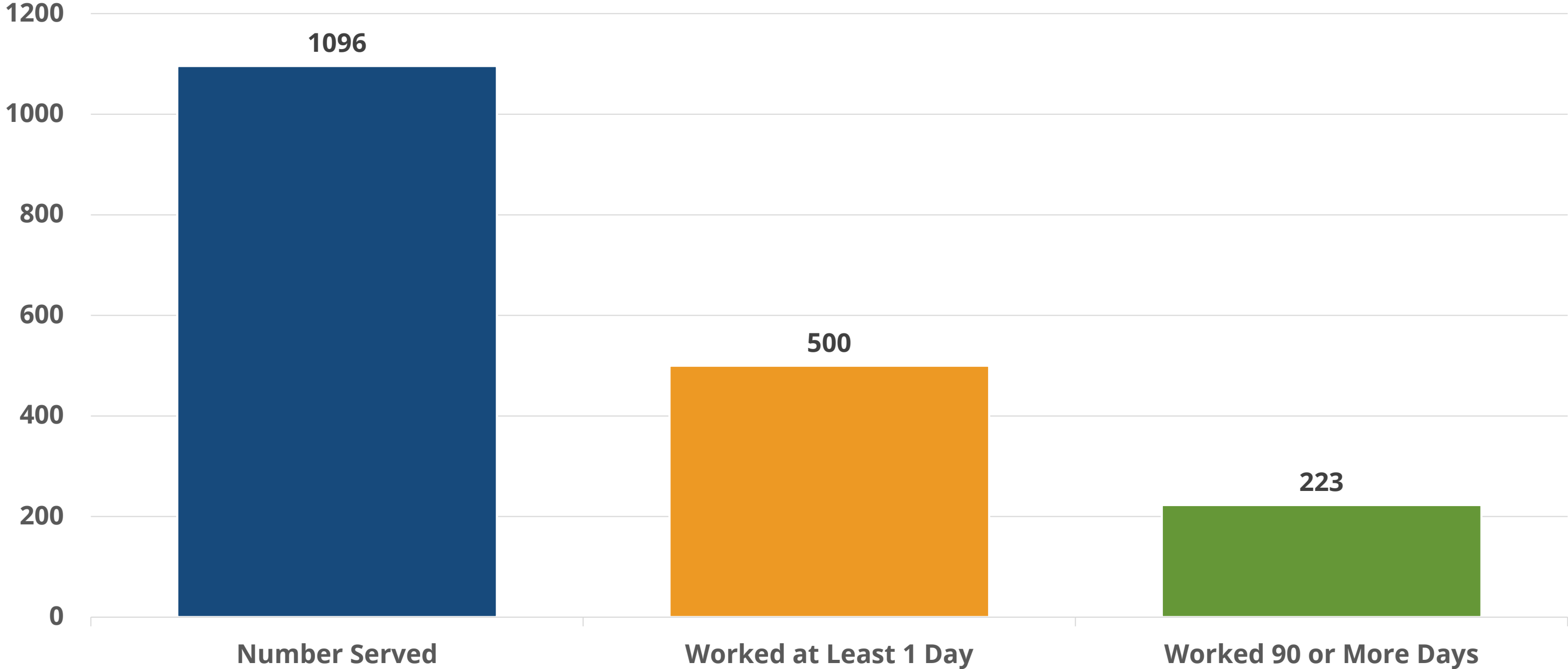

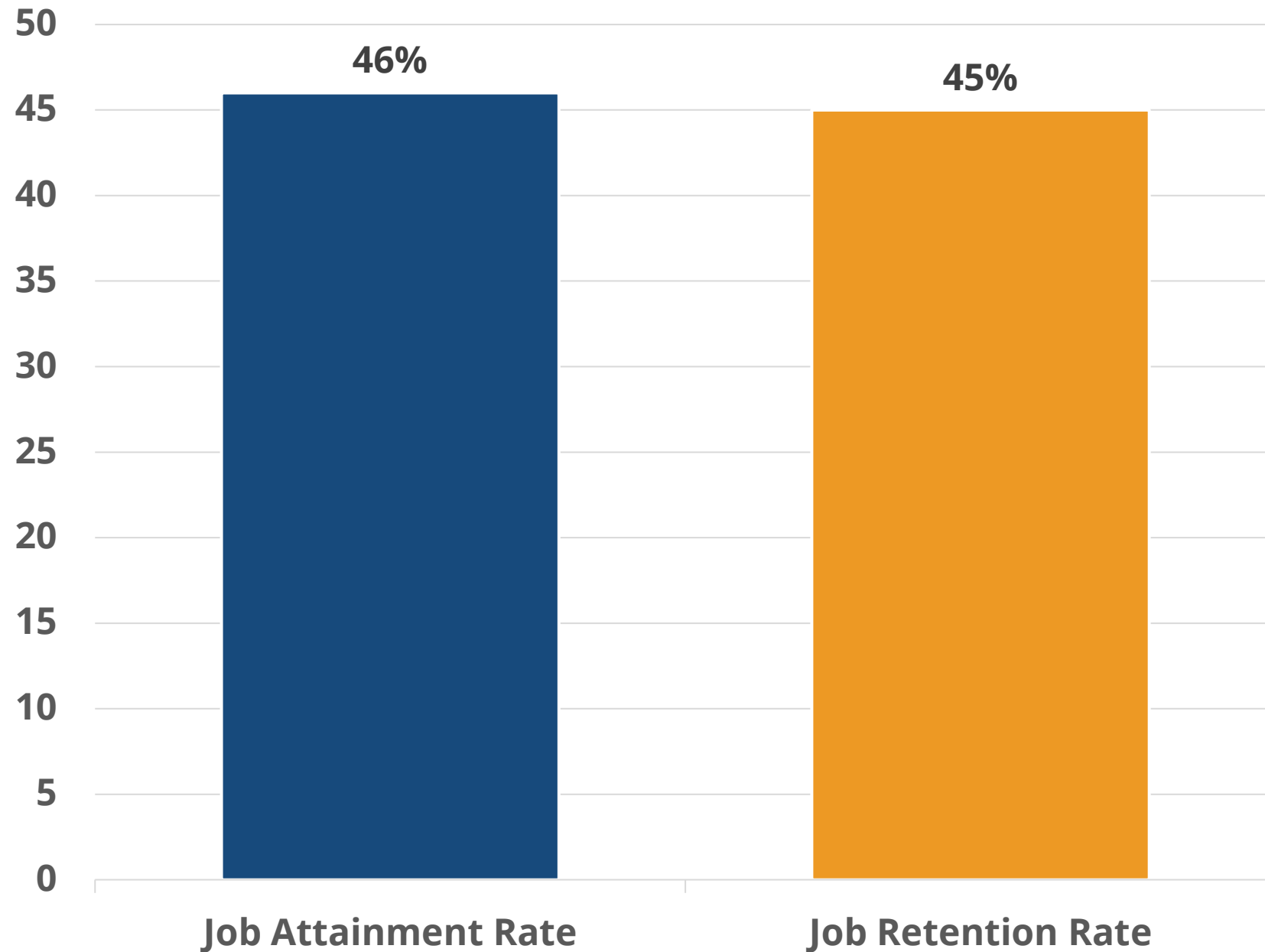

**Job Attainment Rate** – Number of people who worked at least one day divided by the total number served

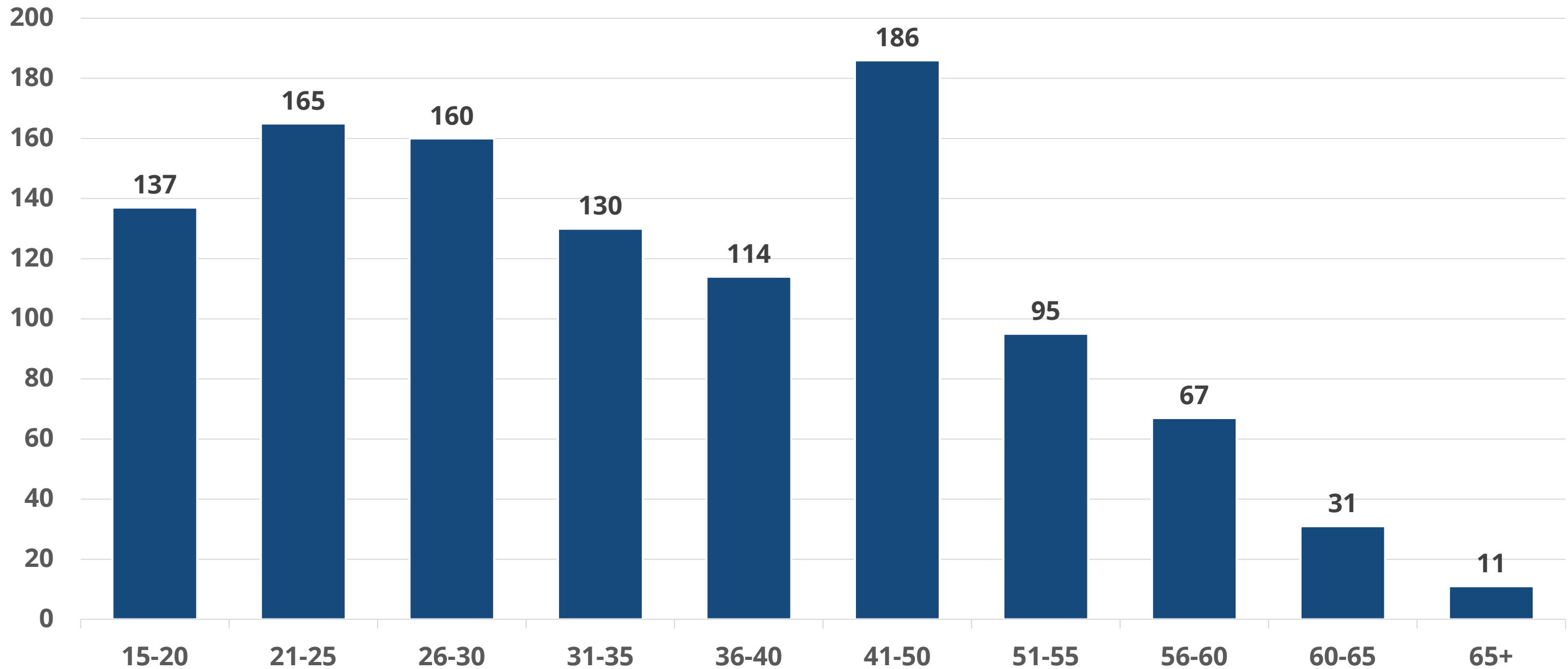
**Job Retention Rate** – Number of people who worked 90 days or more divided by the number who worked at least 1 day

# Average Hours Worked and Wage Earned

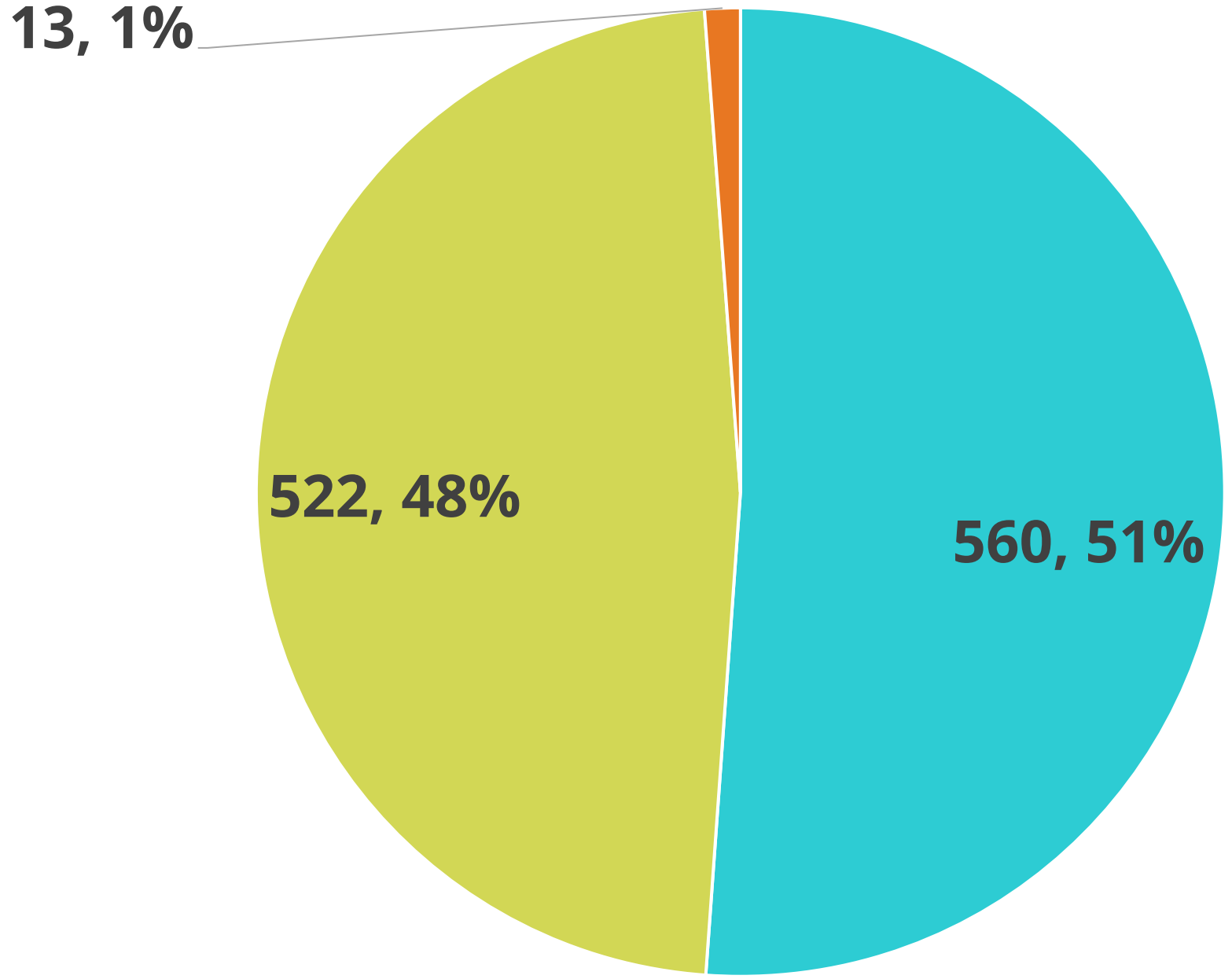
- Average Wage: **\$10.84**

# Demographic Breakdown: Age

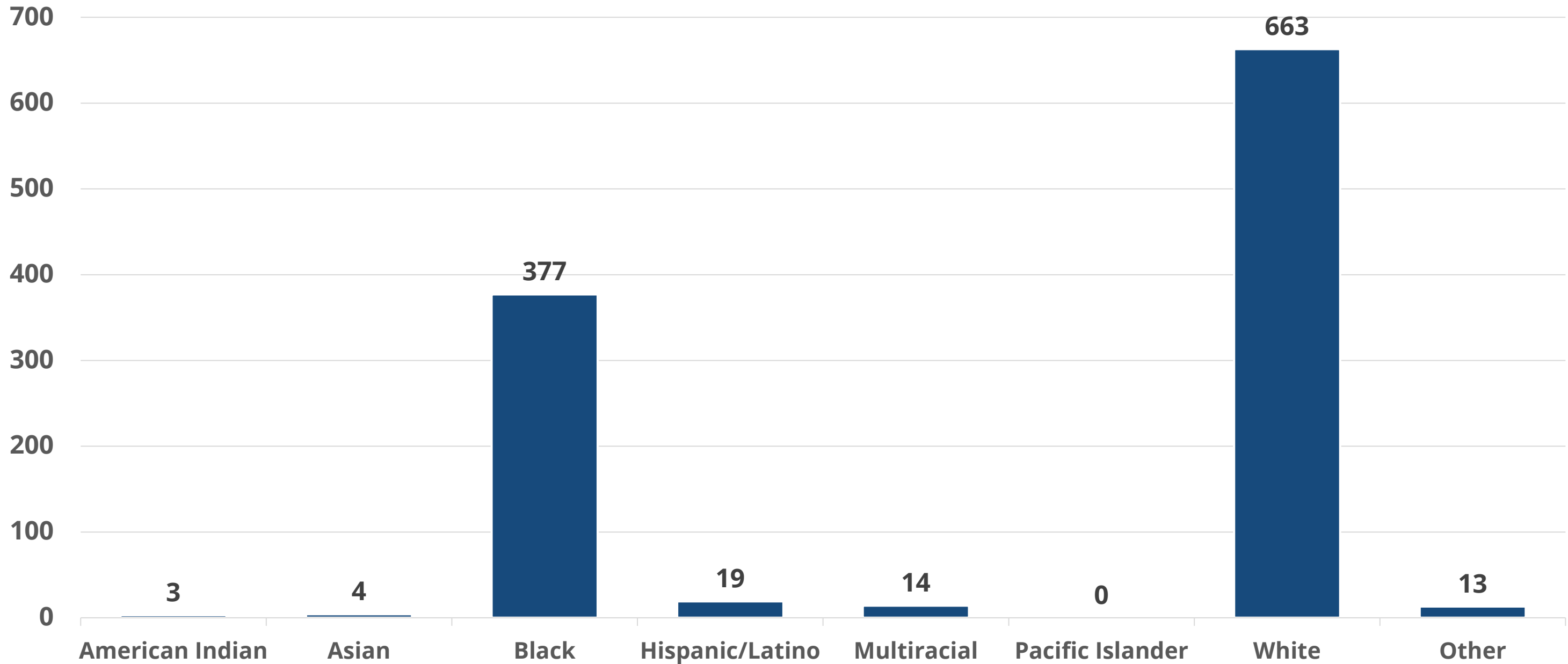


# Demographic Breakdown: Gender

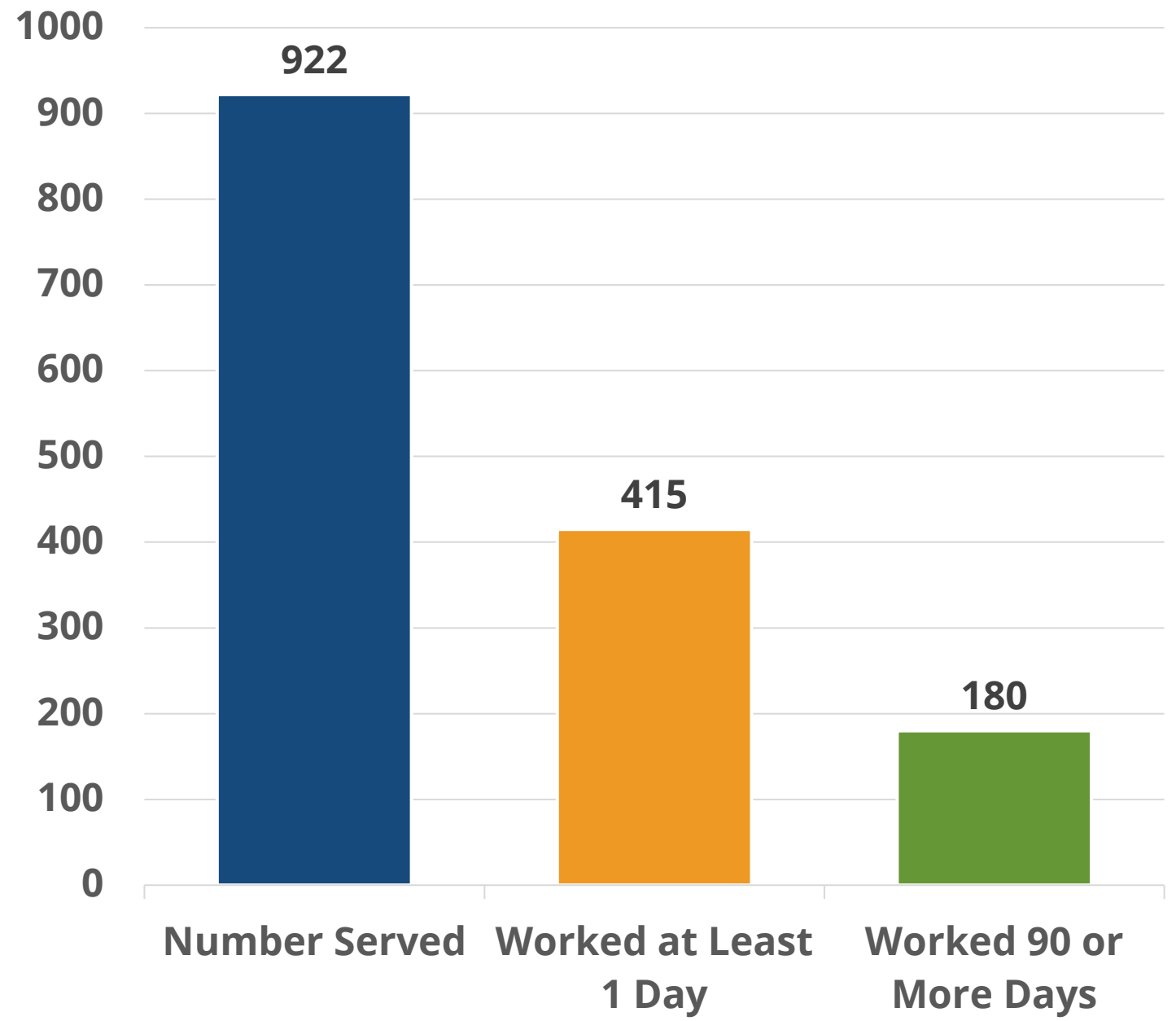

# Demographic Breakdown: Race



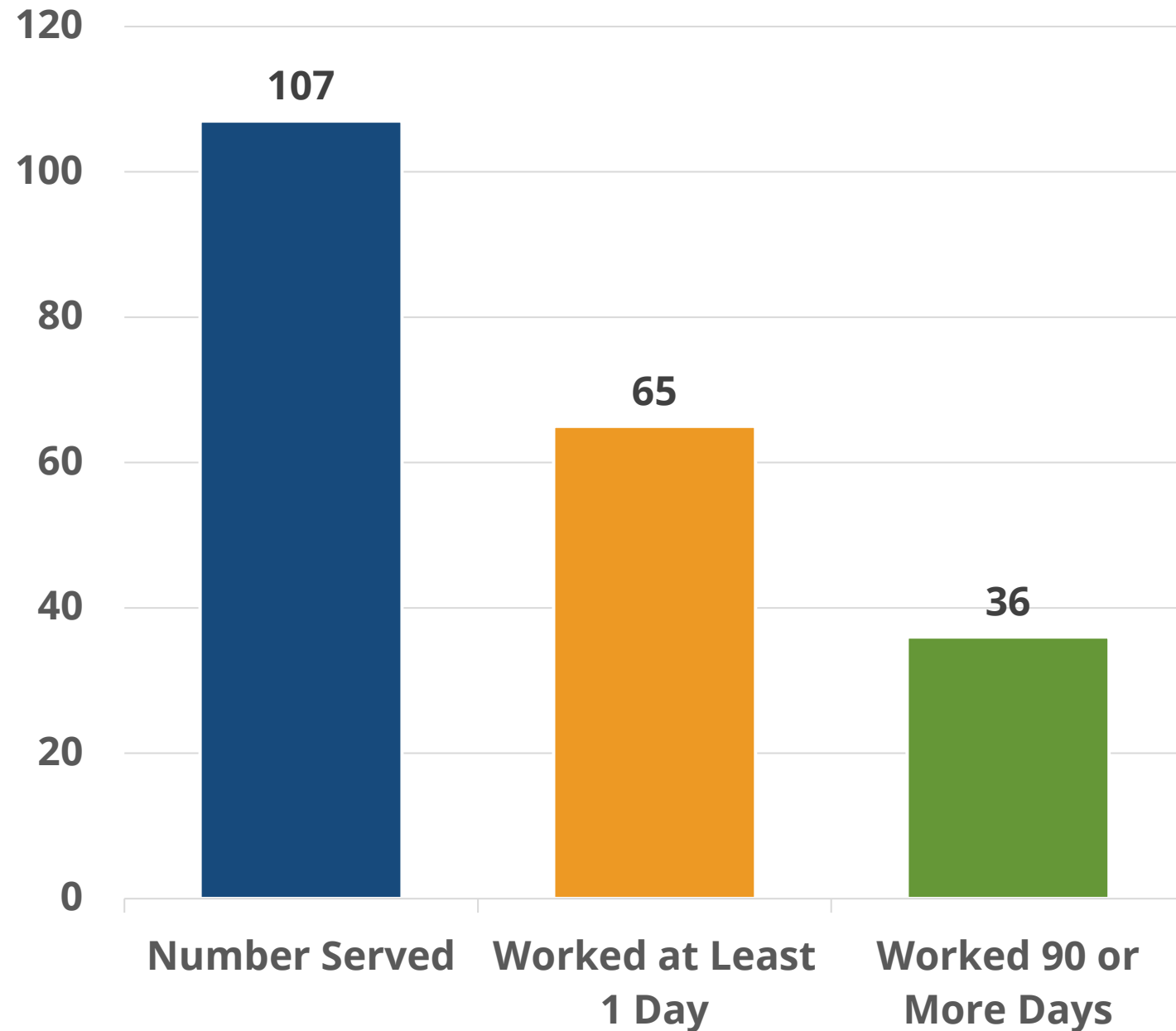
# Data by Program: Vocational Rehabilitation

- Average Hours/Week: 29.5

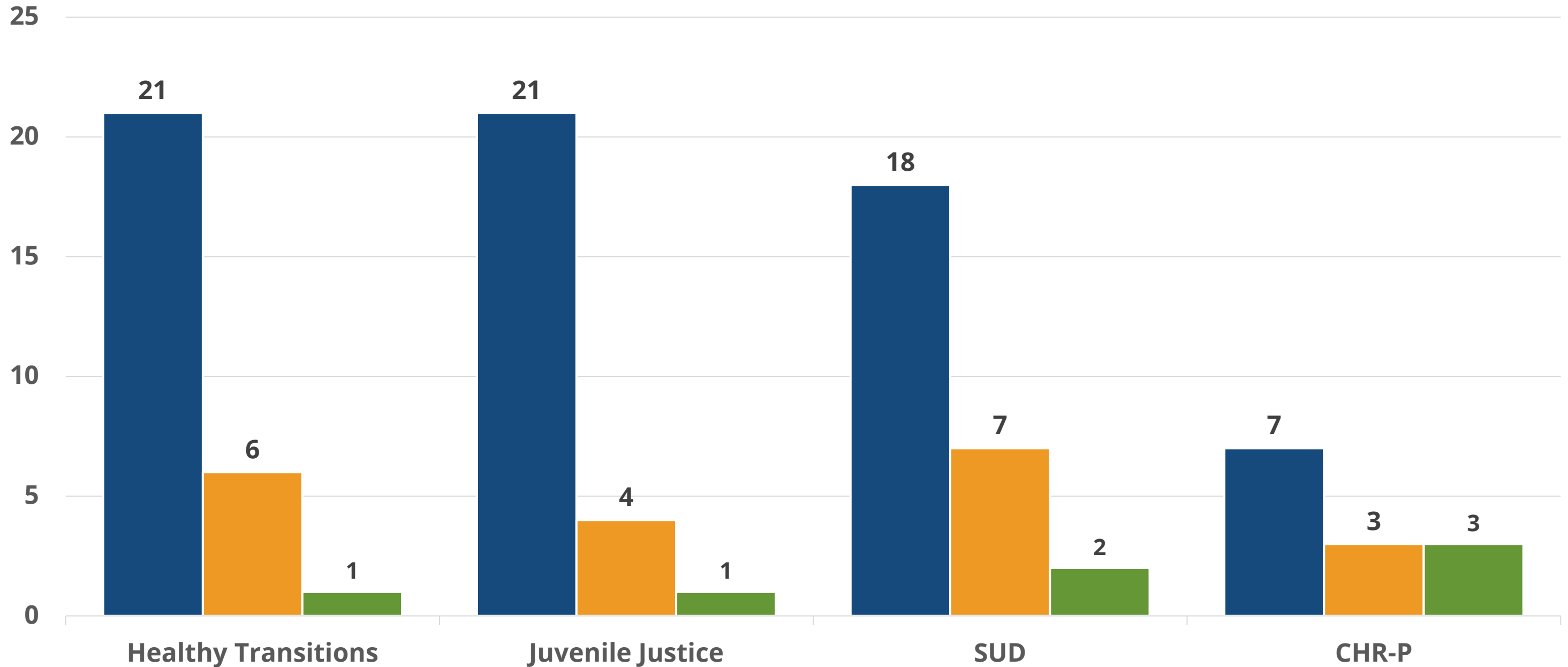


# Data by Program: On Track TN

Welcome to the Tennessee Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services

- Crisis Services**  
Our network of 13 Crisis Services providers are located across the state. From a 24/7/365 crisis line to statewide mobile crisis, crisis walk-in centers, and crisis stabilization units, the crisis continuum serves both adults and youth.
- Mental Health Services**  
The department administers services for people of all ages living with mental illness, co-occurring disorders, or serious emotional disturbances. Services include housing, crisis services, suicide prevention, and peer recovery.
- Substance Abuse Services**  
The department plans, develops, administers, and evaluates a statewide system of prevention, treatment, and recovery support services for people at risk of or experiencing substance use disorder.
- Hospital Services**  
The department operates four Regional Mental Health Institutes in Nashville, Memphis, Chattanooga, and Bolivar and contracts for emergency psychiatric admissions at three private hospitals in East Tennessee.
