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ETHRA's **MISSION** is to provide services throughout the region that help families and individuals remain independent and with opportunities to succeed.

ETHRA's Senior Nutrition Program served in excess of 482,000 meals last year. Each meal is a **unit of service**. Robert, who receives a meal, has a long list of health conditions and diseases. He has trouble getting around and does not drive. However, these misfortunes cannot contain his extremely independent spirit. Many people in his condition would be living in a facility where they could receive care. The Senior Nutrition Program delivers Robert's meal to his home, made from a storage container. He has received help from ETHRA CSBG and other agencies including his county. He also receives home health visits. His determination to maintain his independence is an inspiring quality and it is ETHRA's **Mission** and privilege to assist him however possible in that endeavor.



Dear Friends,

I am happy to share with you a brief look at the work ETHRA staff has accomplished in the past year and the impact those services provide in our region.

Looking at our numbers you may see that our Transportation Program provided 297,077 trips to clients in our region enabling East Tennesseans to get to doctors, stores, work, and other necessary appointments. ETHRA Corrections, Community Intervention Services, and Misdemeanor Probation programs supervised 11,556 clients assisting not only the client to improve their lives, but their families who depend on them for support. Through 710 housing vouchers, over 2100 individuals were able to stay in safe affordable housing. ETHRA's

Aging programs provided over 1,066,000 services to the elderly and disabled in the area, helping some of them to remain in their own homes longer.

While these numbers are an indicator of the work we have accomplished, they are just numbers. ETHRA's Senior Nutrition Program served 482,136 meals. Sometimes this is the only human contact these seniors have during their day. That meal is a unit of service. When a member of our Homemaker program goes into a home in one of our counties where an elderly person in failing health, often exhibiting signs of mental illness or dementia, has no one to care for them and no family, or even worse, has family who take advantage of them and leave them with no resources to meet their needs, it is called a unit of service.

This term is a nondescript label for a very important transaction. This one unit of service or one contact visit, can often lead to many services to the client, helping them to remain independently in their homes or to receive much needed care. This happens many times a day throughout the ETHRA service area. ETHRA staff meets the needs of individuals and families in our area with compassion and a true commitment to serve.

I want to extend a personal word of thanks to our Board and Policy Council members for their leadership and support which helps to make our job easier. Their support with our Legislators is very important to ETHRA programs.



In the early morning mist Charlotte walks around her van completing her pre-trip inspection as she has every work day of the

last 30 Budget Years. She has transported the folks of Blount County to work, medical appointments and other important destinations that they were not able to drive to themselves. Shirley who has driven an ETHRA van in Sevier County for 21 years completes her inspection and arranges to meet Maintenance before her first wheel chair pick up due to a malfunction of the lift. Rhonda, who has driven a van in Cocke County for 21 years, merges into traffic to pick up her first client of the day. A substantial number of ETHRA's trips are taking people to school and work. Rhonda is transporting students to a local college this morning. These ladies have driven for a combined 72 years. They have driven millions of miles transporting thousands and thousands of clients. Whether it was a trip home from Vanderbilt Hospital or a trip down to the grocery for milk and bread it was crucial to the individual transported and it was a **unit of service**. They are just three among over 100 ETHRA Transportation drivers, Maintenance and support staff who fall under the Transportation line in the budget.

By the homemaker's next visit, He will be thankful for the meals prepared on the recovered stove. He has been a victim, but will be alright for now thanks to his **Homemaker** and a **Unit of Service**.
