


# Overview

- Purpose: To compare Tennessee's reported outcomes on living situation and employment to other southeastern states and the United States.
- Data source: Multi-state data comes from the FY2012 and FY2013 Uniform Reporting Systems (URS) tables.
- TN data is collected by the internal and external sources listed below:
  - Crisis Services
  - Behavioral Health Safety Net
  - Avatar
  - Private psychiatric hospital data
  - TennCare
- Population: Anyone receiving a behavioral health service.
- Compared states contiguous with Tennessee.
- Methodologies by which other states collect data are unknown.

The Tennessee rate was higher than the contiguous states and the U.S. rate in both FY2012 and FY2013 for living situation: Private residence.

Figure 1. Living situation FY2012 and FY2013: Private residence




## Tennessee was below the U.S. rate in both FY2012 and FY2013 for living situation: Homeless/Shelter.

Figure 2. Living situation FY2012 and FY2013: Homeless/Shelter





Tennessee was ranked third in both fiscal years for individuals whose living situation was jail/correctional facility. In FY2013, TN was below the U.S. rate.
