Description

To become a licensed EMT in the state of Tennessee, aspirants have to undergo a training program to develop emergency medical skills. In Tennessee, the students have to qualify NREMT examinations to obtain state license. The state considers four level of training, under which, students are taught basic, as well as advanced life supporting methods. EMT training in Tennessee is designed to prepare students for a brilliant career. The NREMT is accredited by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies (NCCA), the accreditation body of the National Organization for Competency Assurance (NOCA). The NCCA's mission is to help ensure the health, welfare, and safety of the public through the accreditation of a variety of certification programs/organizations that assess professional competency. The NREMT is also affiliated with the Commission on the Accreditation of Allied Health Educational Programs (CAAHEP). The CNA credential allows students to enter the health care field as a certified health care provider and is required, by law, for all nurse aide practitioners in Tennessee.

Registration Procedures

- Create a login on the [NREMT](#) website.
- Complete a National Registry online application, including truthfully completing the Licensing Action and criminal statements.
 - The NREMT may deny certification or take other appropriate actions in regards to applicants for certification or recertification when a criminal conviction has occurred.
- Pay the application fee of \$65.00 (US funds). The application fee is non-transferable and non-refundable. This fee is charged for each attempt of the cognitive examination.

- You will receive an Authorization to Test (ATT) once you are eligible for the exam. The ATT letter contains scheduling instructions and important details concerning proper identification required at testing centers.

Number of Questions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The NREMT Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) cognitive exam is a computer adaptive test (CAT). The number of items a candidate can expect on the Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) exam will range from 80 to 110. The psychomotor exam provides a hands-on opportunity for candidates to demonstrate skills.
Type of Questions	The exam will cover the entire spectrum of EMS care including: Airway, Respiration & Ventilation, Cardiology & Resuscitation; Trauma; Medical & Obstetrics/Gynecology; and EMS Operations. Items related to patient care are focused on adult and geriatric patients (85%) and pediatric patients (15%). In order to pass the exam, you must meet a standard level of competency. The passing standard is defined by the ability to provide safe and effective entry level emergency medical care.
