A History of Liberty Gap

Liberty Gap is located in north Bedford County, near Bell Buckle, Tennessee. Months after the Battle of Murfreesboro, Federal troops began pushing Confederates south toward Tullahoma and Hoover's Gap. Liberty Gap became a strategic location during the Tullahoma Campaign.

Mr. Wayne Ison will provide a history of Liberty Gap, including the Civil War Battle that took place there. This will be a great opportunity to learn more about middle Tennessee's Civil War history.




