
June Meeting Cancelled for Bonnaroo



Old Stone Fort Summer Solstice Sunrise – June 21, 2013

Join the Park staff to watch the Summer Solstice sunrise, June 21. The Native Americans, who built this hilltop enclosure, aligned the entryway to the summer solstice sunrise. Various rituals and/or ceremonies probably took place within the enclosure on the summer solstice. The Almanac lists the sunrise to occur at 5:29 am. Bring your coffee and join us for this glimpse into Native American prehistory.
