

Assistant Attorney General - Civil Litigation and State Services Division

The Civil Litigation and State Services (CLASS) Division represents the state in a number of diverse areas including:

- Representing the State in employment litigation in state and federal courts throughout Tennessee. These cases often involve claims of discrimination or retaliation in the workplace. These are typically fact-specific matters that require tenacity in defending the State's interests.
- Litigating breach of contract claims. While some of these cases concern modest sums, many have millions of dollars at issue. The division also reviews State contracts and represents the State Building Commission on real estate matters. In addition, the division provides advice on procurement issues and defends bid protests in Chancery Court. Strong organizational skills and attention to detail are a necessity.
- Representing educational agencies, including the Tennessee Department of Education, Tennessee Board of Education, and Tennessee Board of Regents and affiliated colleges and universities. These cases regularly involve constitutional challenges and concern matters of statewide significance. A strong background in constitutional law is beneficial.

Travel and litigation are required. All attorney applicants must possess strong analytical, writing, and oral advocacy skills.
