



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
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OVERVIEW OF REPORT



This report is prepared pursuant to T.C.A. §49-4-903(b), which directs the Tennessee Higher Education Commission (THEC) to:


“...provide assistance to the general assembly and to the Tennessee Student Assistance Corporation (TSAC) by researching and analyzing data concerning the scholarship and grant programs created under this part, including, but not limited to, student success and scholarship renewal.”

The Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarship (TELS) program was designed to meet the unique needs of the State of Tennessee, while also incorporating the hallmark elements of existing merit-based aid programs in other states. Developed through a process involving elected officials and members of the academic community, the TELS program aims to address the following broad public policy objectives:

- Improve academic achievement in high school through scholarship incentive (GAMS, HOPE, ASPIRE);
- Provide financial assistance as a means of promoting access to higher education (ASPIRE, Access);
- Retain the state’s “best and brightest” students in Tennessee colleges and universities (GAMS); and
- Enhance and promote economic and community development through workforce training (Wilder-Naifeh).

The Tennessee Education Lottery began operations on January 20, 2004. Lottery proceeds fund scholarships for Tennessee students attending eligible public or private institutions across the state. Initial qualification and renewal criteria for the program were set in 2003. The legislature adjusted the qualification criteria in 2005 and the renewal criteria in 2008. Additionally, the legislature added a Non-Traditional Student Grant and Dual Enrollment Grant in 2005, and several smaller provisions in 2006 and 2008. Lottery scholarship coverage for summer course enrollments of six credit hours or more began in summer 2012. The Tennessee Promise will take effect during the 2015-16 academic year and decrease the HOPE base award for freshman and sophomores while increasing the award for juniors and seniors.

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
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Technical Notes & Definitions




- All data contained within this report are from the Tennessee Higher Education Commission’s (THEC) Student Information System (SIS), as reported to the Commission by institutions through their respective governing board or association.
- THEC’S SIS is a transactional database; therefore, data changes year over year. Each year both historical and current year’s data are rerun, reflecting a snapshot of THEC’s SIS at that moment in time. As a result, data reported in previous years’ annual reports may differ from data in this year’s report.
- Students are identified by higher education sector and scholarship type at college entry.
- Students with inadmissible or missing data values are reported in the Unknown category.
- Unless otherwise noted, all tables and figures include TBR Universities, TBR Community Colleges, UT Campuses, and private institutions, and HOPE, GAMS, ASPIRE, and Access programs.
- When Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarship (TELS) students are compared to the general student population (e.g., in Section 6), the general population refers to public institutions only because THEC data on private institutions are limited to TELS recipients.
- The “6-year graduation rate” is defined as the percent of TELS first-time freshmen who attained either an associate’s or bachelor’s degree, whichever is higher, within six years of enrollment regardless of scholarship status at graduation.
- The “graduation rate with TELS intact” is defined as the percent of TELS first-time freshmen who attained either an associate’s or bachelor’s degree, whichever is higher, within five years of enrollment without losing scholarship eligibility (having the scholarship intact in the fall semester prior to graduation). Five years is chosen for this statistic because that is the maximum number of years for which students can renew a scholarship.
- Renewal, retention, and graduation rates are attributed to the higher education sector and scholarship type at college entry.
- Percentages may not add to 100 percent due to rounding.

Therefore, when tables are presented, individual cells containing five observations or fewer are suppressed. The suppressed information, however, is included in table totals.

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Program Overview

- Since the Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarship (TELS) program began, the program costs and the number of students served have more than doubled from 40,000 students and \$100 million in 2005-06 to over 100,000 students and \$303 million in 2013-14 (**Table 4**).
- The maximum HOPE award covered as much as 78 percent of average tuition and fees at a public 4-year institution in 2006-2007, and 77 percent at a public 2-year institution. By way of contrast in 2014-15, the maximum HOPE award, excluding summer, covered only 48 percent of the average tuition and fees at public four-year institutions, and 50 percent at two-year institutions (**Table 5 & Figure 2**).
- The proportion of TELS eligible first-time freshmen who qualified for the base HOPE award has declined from a high of 68 percent in 2008 to a low of 61 percent in 2012. The proportion qualifying for ASPIRE, the need-based supplement, increased during this time, from 24 percent to 31 percent (**Table 8 & Figure 4**). This shift was likely related to the economic recession, which is showing some signs of recovery. In 2013, the proportion qualifying for the HOPE award increased to 64 percent, and ASPIRE decreased to 29 percent, a trend that continued into 2014. To qualify for the ASPIRE supplemental award, a dependent student's family must have an adjusted gross income (AGI) of \$36,000 or less.
- Since 2005, the percentage of new freshmen receiving a TELS award has increased at public universities and community colleges, indicating better academic preparation and performance by high school seniors since implementation of the TELS program (**Table 9 & Figure 5**).

Recipient Demographics

- Since 2005, there has been a shift in the family income profile of TELS first-time freshmen. While the proportion of scholarship recipients with an AGI below \$36,000 was nearly the same in 2014 as it was in 2005, the proportion with a family AGI above \$96,000 has increased by 7 percentage points for this time period (**Table 12**).

- After adjusting for inflation, median AGI has decreased for recipients of all core award types except GAMS, indicating the need to revisit the \$36,000 AGI cut-off point for ASPIRE recipients.
- The median family AGI of TELS first-time freshmen has declined for African Americans between 2005 and 2014, and the difference between the highest (Caucasian) and lowest (African American) median family AGI by ethnicity has increased over the same period (**Table 14 & Figure 8**).
- Less than four percent of TELS first-time freshmen were enrolled part-time in fall 2014 (**Table 19**).
- The proportion of African American TELS first-time freshmen eligible for a Pell grant has increased from 56.1 percent in fall 2005 to 72.8 percent in fall 2014, compared to an increase from 24.5 percent to 39.4 percent for Caucasian students over this same time period (**Table 20**).
- Sixty-five percent of Caucasian TELS first-time freshmen qualify for a HOPE or ASPIRE award by meeting both eligibility criteria (a 21 ACT score and 3.0 high school GPA), compared to 39 percent for African American first-time freshmen (**Figure 10**). As shown in Section 3: Scholarship Renewal, students who meet both eligibility criteria have renewal rates higher than students that meet only one criterion.

Scholarship Renewal

- Fifty-six percent of 2013 TELS first-time freshmen retained their scholarship in the fall of 2014 (**Table 24 & Figure 11**).
- Since 2005, the UT system's one year renewal rate increased from 59 percent to 69 percent in 2011. This increase coincided with an increase in freshmen ACT composite scores over this time period. However, UT's renewal rates have decreased over the past two years to 61 percent in 2013. TBR universities, community colleges, and private institutions have experienced slight increases or maintained renewal rates over time (**Figure 11**).
- There is a positive relationship between students' AGI and one year scholarship renewal rates, indicating that students with higher AGIs tend to have higher renewal rates (**Table 27**).
- In fall 2014, 64 percent of fall 2013 HOPE and ASPIRE first-time freshmen who met both eligibility criteria (ACT & GPA) renewed their awards for their sophomore year, compared to 47 percent who qualified on GPA alone, and 22 percent of those who qualified on ACT alone (**Table 28 & Figure 13**).

- Scholarship renewal rates for HOPE and ASPIRE recipients have gradually increased since the program's inception, followed by a slight downturn since 2010. ACCESS recipients have the lowest renewal rates, which have decreased over time: 18 percent renewal in 2013, down from 22 percent in 2005 (**Figure 12**).
- Scholarship renewal rates are 12 percentage points higher for entering freshmen recipients who do not need remedial or developmental coursework (**Table 29**).


Retention for Non-Renewals

- Sixty-two percent of fall 2013 TELS first-time freshmen (FTF) who lost their award returned to college for their sophomore year (**Table 35 & Figure 14**).
- The percent of TELS first-time freshmen who lost their award and returned to college for their sophomore year increased for the fall 2013 FTF cohort, in comparison to the fall 2011 and 2012 FTF cohorts, for all scholarship programs (**Table 36 & Figure 15**).
- In 2013, 70 percent of African American TELS first-time freshmen returned for their sophomore year after losing their TELS scholarship, compared with 59 percent of Caucasian TELS FTF (**Table 38**).
- Non-renewing students with a family adjusted gross income between \$12,000 and \$72,000 tend to return to college the following fall at about the same rate, regardless of their family income (**Table 39**).
- Non-renewing students who initially qualified with both a GPA and ACT score returned to college at a higher rate than students who qualified based on ACT or GPA alone. (**Table 40 & Figure 16**).

Graduation with TELS Intact

- For the fall 2009 cohort, 30.7 percent of TELS first-time freshmen graduated in 5 years with scholarships intact (**Table 41 & Figure 17**). The graduation rates for the fall 2009 cohort decreased in comparison to past cohorts. This decrease may indicate that a greater number of students enrolled at the height of the recession but chose not to graduate once the economy improved.
- Among the 2009 TELS first-time freshmen cohort, 40.5 percent graduated in 5 years with the scholarship intact at private institutions, compared to 35.7 percent at UT campuses, 26.6 percent at TBR universities, and 24.4 percent at community colleges (**Table 41 & Figure 17**).

- Thirty-three percent of 2009 Caucasian TELS first-time freshmen graduated in 5-years with the scholarship intact compared to 14.5 percent for African American TELS first-time freshmen (**Table 44**).
- Further disaggregation of ACT and high school GPA data indicate that although postsecondary success is influenced by a variety of factors, students with strong high school GPAs and average to below average ACT scores tend to have higher college graduation rates than students with strong ACT scores and average to below-average high school GPAs.
- The 6-year graduation rate for 2008 TELS first-time freshmen, regardless of whether they kept scholarships intact, was 58.3 percent. (**Table 51**).
- For the fall 2008 TELS first-time freshmen cohort, Caucasian students (59.7 percent) had a higher 6-year graduation rate than African American students (47.9 percent) by twelve percentage points (**Table 54**).
- Fall to fall cohort scholarship renewal and college retention rates have remained fairly stable over time (**Table 55**).
- Approximately 23 percent of first-time freshmen TELS recipients from the 2010 cohort graduated within 4 years, with or without the scholarship intact (**Table 55**). This is a decrease from 29 percent of the 2009 cohort.
- For the 2008 TELS first-time freshmen cohort, there is a positive relationship between students' AGI and their longitudinal renewal and graduation rates, as students with higher AGIs have higher renewal and graduation rates (**Table 57**).



Section 1: Program Overview

Program Overview: Key Findings











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Section 2: Recipient Demographics

Recipient Demographics: Key Findings


- Since 2005, there has been a shift in the family income profile of TELS first-time freshmen. While the proportion of scholarship recipients with a family adjusted gross income (AGI) below \$36,000 was nearly the same in 2014 as it was in 2005, the proportion with a family AGI above \$96,000 has increased by 7 percentage points for this time period (**Table 12**).
- After adjusting for inflation, median AGI has decreased for recipients of all core award types except GAMS, indicating the need to revisit the \$36,000 AGI cut-off point for ASPIRE recipients (**Table 13**).
- The median family AGI of TELS first-time freshmen has declined for African Americans between 2005 and 2014, and the difference between the highest (Caucasian) and lowest (African American) median family AGI by ethnicity has increased over the same period (**Table 14 & Figure 8**).
- Less than four percent of TELS first-time freshmen were enrolled part-time in fall 2014 (**Table 19**).
- The proportion of African American TELS first-time freshmen eligible for a Pell grant has increased from 56.1 percent in fall 2005 to 72.8 percent in fall 2014, compared to an increase from 24.5 percent to 39.4 percent for Caucasian students over this same time period (**Table 20**).
- Sixty-five percent of Caucasian TELS first-time freshmen qualify for a HOPE or ASPIRE award by meeting both eligibility criteria (a 21 ACT score and 3.0 high school GPA), compared to 39 percent for African American first-time freshmen (**Figure 10**). As shown in Section 3: Scholarship Renewal, students who meet both eligibility criteria have renewal rates higher than students that meet only one criterion.

First-time Freshmen Lottery Scholarship Receipt by Ethnicity, Fall 2005 - Fall 2014









by Initial Qualifications and System, Fall 2014







Section 3: Scholarship Renewal

Renewal Requirements

Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarship (TELS) recipients are evaluated for scholarship renewal after every 24 attempted credit hours. At the 24- and 48-hour check points, students must have earned a cumulative college GPA of 2.75 or higher to remain eligible for the scholarship. Upon attempting 72 credit hours, a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 is required to remain eligible. This continues at each subsequent 24 credit hour check point, up to 120 credit hours.

State law permits those with 72 or greater credit hours to maintain eligibility if their cumulative GPA is less than 3.0, as long as they:

- have maintained a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.75;
- have earned a semester grade point average of at least 3.0 for the semester in which continuing eligibility was reviewed;
- have enrolled full-time in the semester when continuing eligibility was reviewed; and
- will enroll full-time in the subsequent semester.

The TELS award is available for up to five years, baccalaureate degree attainment, or 120 attempted credit hours, whichever comes first. The 120 hour cap is applicable only to students who first received TELS in fall 2009 and after. Students in programs requiring more than 120 credit hours are exempt from the 120 hour cap. These students can receive a scholarship until they have attempted the number of hours required to earn the degree, not to exceed 136 credit hours.

Scholarship Renewal: Key Findings

- Fifty-six percent of 2013 TELS first-time freshmen retained their scholarship in the fall of 2014 (**Table 24 & Figure 11**).
- Since 2005, the UT system's one year renewal rate increased from 59 percent to 69 percent in 2011. This increase coincided with an increase in freshmen ACT composite scores over this time period. However, UT's renewal rates have decreased over the past year to 61 percent in 2013. TBR universities, community colleges, and private institutions have experienced slight increases or maintained renewal rates over time (**Figure 11**).
- There is a positive relationship between students' adjusted gross income (AGI) and one year scholarship renewal rates, indicating that students with higher AGIs tend to have higher renewal rates (**Table 27**).
- In fall 2014, 64 percent of fall 2013 HOPE and ASPIRE first-time freshmen who met both eligibility criteria (ACT & GPA) renewed their awards for their sophomore year, compared to 47 percent who qualified on GPA alone, and 22 percent of those who qualified on ACT alone (**Table 28 & Figure 13**).
- Scholarship renewal rates for HOPE and ASPIRE recipients have gradually increased since the program's inception, followed by a slight downturn since 2010. ACCESS recipients have the lowest renewal rates, which have decreased over time: 18 percent renewal in 2013, down from 22 percent in 2005 (**Figure 12**).
- Scholarship renewal rates are 12 percentage points higher for entering freshmen recipients who do not need remedial or developmental coursework (**Table 29**).

Fall 2004 - Fall 2013 TELS First-time Freshmen





Section 4: College Retention for Scholarship Non-Renewals

Retention for Non-Renewals: Key Findings


- Sixty-two percent of fall 2013 TELS first-time freshmen (FTF) who lost their award returned to college for their sophomore year (**Table 35 & Figure 14**).
- The percent of TELS first-time freshmen who lost their award and returned to college for their sophomore year increased for the fall 2013 FTF cohort, in comparison to the fall 2011 and 2012 FTF cohorts, for all scholarship programs (**Table 36 & Figure 15**).
- In 2013, 70 percent of African American TELS first-time freshmen returned for their sophomore year after losing their TELS scholarship, compared with 59 percent of Caucasian TELS FTF (**Table 38**).
- Non-renewing students with a family adjusted gross income between \$12,000 and \$72,000 tend to return to college the following fall at about the same rate, regardless of their family income (**Table 39**).
- Non-renewing students who initially qualified with both a GPA and ACT score returned to college at a higher rate than students who qualified based on ACT or GPA alone. (**Table 40 & Figure 16**).







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Section 5: 5-year Graduation Rates with TELS Intact

5-year Graduate Rates with TELS Intact: Key Findings

TELS awards are available for up to five years, baccalaureate degree attainment, or 120 cumulative attempted credit hours, whichever comes first. This section explores graduation rates during the last possible year of scholarship eligibility.

- For the fall 2009 cohort, 30.7 percent of TELS first-time freshmen graduated in 5 years with scholarships intact (**Table 41 & Figure 17**). The graduation rates for the fall 2009 cohort decreased in comparison to past cohorts. This decrease may indicate that a greater number of students enrolled at the height of the recession but chose not to graduate once the economy improved.
- Among the 2009 TELS first-time freshmen cohort, 40.5 percent graduated in 5 years with the scholarship intact at private institutions, compared to 35.7 percent at UT campuses, 26.6 percent at TBR universities, and 24.4 percent at community colleges (**Table 41 & Figure 17**).
- GAMS students' graduation rate (69.3 percent) with the scholarship intact is double the intact graduation rates of other scholarship programs for the fall 2009 first-time freshmen cohort (**Table 42 & Figure 18**).
- Almost 35 percent of female TELS first-time freshmen in 2009 graduated in 5-years with the scholarship intact compared to 25.7 percent for male TELS first-time freshmen in this cohort (**Table 43**).
- Thirty-three percent of 2009 Caucasian TELS first-time freshmen graduated in 5-years with the scholarship intact compared to 14.5 percent for African American TELS first-time freshmen (**Table 44**).
- In 2009, HOPE and ASPIRE first-time freshmen who met both eligibility criteria (ACT and HSGPA) had a graduation rate higher than TELS first-time freshmen that qualified based on their GPA or ACT score alone (**Table 45 & Figure 19**).
- Further disaggregation of ACT and high school GPA data indicate that although postsecondary success is influenced by a variety of factors, students with strong high school GPAs and average to below average ACT scores tend to have higher college graduation rates than students with strong ACT scores and average to below-average high school GPAs.







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Section 6: 6-year College Graduation Rates for TELS Recipients

6-year Graduation Rates: Key Findings

Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarship (TELS) recipients are evaluated for **scholarship renewal** following every 24, 48, 72, and 96 attempted credit hours. At the 24- and 48-hour checkpoints, students must have earned a minimum cumulative college GPA of 2.75 to remain eligible for the scholarship. Upon attempting 72 credit hours, a minimum cumulative college GPA of 3.0 is required to maintain scholarship eligibility. This continues at each subsequent 24 credit hour check point up to 120 credit hours. **College retention for scholarship non-renewals** is the rate at which students who lost the scholarship returned to college the following fall semester.

Graduation rates include students graduating anywhere within the public higher education system, as well as some private institutions. For purposes of this analysis, “graduated” includes students who lost the scholarship before attaining the degree.

- The 6-year graduation rate for 2008 TELS first-time freshmen, regardless of whether they kept scholarships intact, was 58.3 percent. (**Table 51**).
- Eighty-four percent of 2008 TELS first-time freshmen who qualified for a GAMS scholarship graduated within 6-years, with or without the scholarship intact, compared with 60.3 percent of HOPE recipients, 48.1 percent of ASPIRE recipients, and 31.3 percent of ACCESS recipients (**Table 52 & Figure 21**).
- For the fall 2008 TELS first-time freshmen cohort, Caucasian students (59.7 percent) had a higher 6-year graduation rate than African American students (47.9 percent) by twelve percentage points (**Table 54**).
- 2008 HOPE and ASPIRE first-time freshmen’s 6-year graduation rate (with or without the scholarship intact) for students who met both eligibility criteria (67 percent) was higher than for students that met the GPA only requirement (50 percent) and students that met only the ACT criteria (32 percent) (**Figure 22**).



Fall 2005 – Fall 2008 Cohorts







Upon attempting 72 credit hours, a minimum cumulative college GPA of 3.0 is required to maintain scholarship eligibility. This continues at each subsequent 24 credit hour check point up to 120 credit hours. **College retention for scholarship non-renewals** is the rate at which students who lost the scholarship returned to college the following fall semester.

Graduation rates include students graduating anywhere within the public higher education system, as well as some private institutions. For purposes of this analysis, “graduated” does include students who lost the scholarship before attaining the degree.

- Fall to fall cohort scholarship renewal and college retention rates have remained fairly stable over time (**Table 55**).
- Whether or not 2008 TELS first-time freshmen retained their TELS scholarship after their freshmen year, 82 percent returned for their sophomore year of college. Seventy-five percent of the original freshmen cohort returned for their junior year, and two-thirds (67 percent) returned for their senior year (**Table 55 & Figure 23**).
- Graduation rates, with and without the scholarship intact, have remained fairly stable over time (**Table 55**).
- About 23 percent of first-time freshmen TELS recipients from the 2010 cohort graduated within 4 years, with or without the scholarship intact (**Table 55**). This is a decrease from 29 percent of the 2009 cohort.
- Half of 2009 TELS first-time freshmen graduated within 5 years, but only 31 percent did so with the scholarship intact (**Table 55 & Figure 23**).
- For the 2008 TELS first-time freshmen cohort, there is a positive relationship between students’ Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) and their longitudinal renewal and graduation rates, as students with higher AGIs have higher renewal and graduation rates (**Table 57**).




