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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 38 out of 50 public higher education institutions offer for-credit courses at an off-campus location. Among public universities and community colleges, only the University of Tennessee, Health Science Center campus did not offer off-campus courses. Eleven Tennessee Technological Centers did not offer off-campus courses.
- Although fall 2011 total headcount enrollment slightly increased in Tennessee public higher education, off-campus duplicated headcount enrollment decreased from 14,154 to 13,132, a change of 7.2 percent from fall 2010. Additionally, 1,022 fewer university students enrolled in for-credit courses at off-campus locations in fall 2011 than in fall 2010. The proportion of off-campus participation at community colleges remained steady at 65.5 percent.
- Tennessee Technology Centers (TTC) increased utilization of off campus sites by 18 percent, offering courses at eight new locations in the last year. Consequently, the amount of students enrolling in TTC off-campus locations increased by 50 percent from fall 2010 to fall 2011. Increased enrollment at Chattanooga and Pulaski technology centers accounted for 40 percent of this growth. Technology center off campus locations are being utilized by more part-time students, as full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment decreased by 10.6 percent.

OFF-CAMPUS LOCATION REPORT

Off-campus locations play a significant role within Tennessee's higher education system. They meet the needs of many citizens who are unable to take advantage of the services provided at main campus locations and, in turn, serve the needs of the institution by making education available to more students. It is the responsibility of the Tennessee Higher Education Commission, under the purview of the State, to review and approve any new locations. The specific charge in T.C.A. § 49-7-202(c)(10) states that the Commission shall:

Review and approve or disapprove any proposals by an existing higher education institution to establish a physical presence at any location other than its main campus, or to expand an existing location, which will be utilized for existing administrative purposes or to offer courses for which academic credit is offered. The Commission shall develop policies and procedures governing this process. The provisions of this subdivision shall apply to state technology centers.

Pursuant to the Commission's responsibilities relative to T.C.A. § 49-7-202(c)(10), the following report provides information on the location of off-campus higher education facilities throughout the state.

In reading this report, it is important to note the difference between an off-campus center and an off-campus site. An off-campus *center* must meet the following criteria:

1. There is a continuing administrative presence, as evidenced by at least one full-time or part-time administrator housed on-site, but with the institution's executive personnel housed on another campus;
2. Courses are offered every semester and there is at least one academic program fully available on-site; and
3. The physical facility must be either (1) owned by the institution, (2) leased by the institution, (3) owned by another public institution of higher education, or (4) is provided at no cost to the institution.

An off-campus *site* does not have to meet any of the above criteria and is a physical space that is often used for *credit enrollment only*. Typical offerings at off-campus sites include dual enrollment courses, workforce development opportunities, and/or other short-term, specific instructional needs.

Locations

Students taking credit-bearing courses enrolled at 44 centers and 475 sites in fall 2011 (**Table 1**). The number of centers decreased slightly in the past year, from 46 in fall 2010 to 44 in fall 2011. The number of sites and centers enrolling at least one student taking for-credit courses fell by 4 percent, from 538 in fall 2010 to 519 in fall 2011. Tennessee Board of Regents (TBR) community colleges accounted for 54 percent of all off-campus locations and increased the number of off-campus locations enrolling students from 275 last year to 278 this year. Tennessee Technology Centers (TTC) also increased the number of available off-campus locations from 44 in fall 2010 to 52 in fall 2011. This indicates a growing demand in off-campus locations by these institutions, which account for 10 percent of the total locations utilized. The number of university locations in the TBR and University of Tennessee (UT) systems decreased in the last year by 13.6 percent, with UT showing a marked reduction in utilization of off-campus locations, falling 46 percent.

Headcount Enrollment

Duplicated enrollment is reported for both headcount and FTE analysis, as student enrollment in an off-campus location necessitates enrollment in a main campus location. In fall 2011, off-campus locations served 56,315 students, representing 19 percent of the student enrollment in public higher education for the semester (**Table 2**). Thirty-four percent of the duplicated headcount in community colleges enrolled in courses at an off-campus location in fall 2011. The TTCs, TBR universities, and UT universities enrolled smaller portions of their students at off-campus locations at 13 percent, 11 percent, and 3 percent respectively (**Table 2**). Of particular note is the marked increase in enrollment in off-campus locations by TTC students (50 percent), reflecting a trend towards greater utilization of these locations by technological centers. UT campuses also showed a striking change in off-campus enrollment, falling 28 percent.

Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment

The off-campus locations comprised 13 percent of overall for-credit FTE enrollment at 24,869 (**Table 3**). Off-campus enrollees were less likely to be full time students as indicated by the difference in proportion of FTE enrollment (13%) and total enrollment (19%) in off-campus locations. This reiterates the ancillary nature of off-campus locations, as these facilities offer a minimal number of courses or degree programs. Of note, more students enrolled at community college off-campus locations as full-time students than any other sector, with 28 percent of total full-time equivalent enrollment. However, a trend towards higher utilization of off-campus locations by part-time community college students is evident, as community college FTE fell by

four percent compared to last year. Overall, off-campus FTE enrollment fell more precipitously than off-campus total enrollment, indicating that students utilizing off-campus locations are becoming more likely to be part-time enrollees in higher education.

Notable Institutions

The proportion of institutions' total duplicated headcount enrolled at off-campus locations ranged from a low of 0.5 percent at the University of Tennessee, Chattanooga to a high of 65 percent at Roane State Community College (RSCC). Six institutions enrolled more than 45 percent of their total duplicated headcount at off-campus locations: RSCC 65.4 percent, Motlow State Community College (MSCC) 62.7 percent, TTC Chattanooga 59.5 percent, Walters State Community College (WSCC) 50.9 percent, Dyersburg State Community College (DSCC) 49.1 percent, and Columbia State Community College (COSCC) 46.7 percent. These institutions historically enrolled a high percentage of students at off-campus centers (**Table 4**).

Every public university and community college, with the exception of the UT Health Science Center campus, used off-campus locations during fall 2011 (**Tables 5 & 6**). Additionally, 16 of the 27 TTCs enrolled students at off-campus locations. Tennessee Technological University and the University of Memphis had the most off campus locations with students enrolled at 60 and 34 locations, respectively. Aside from UT Martin, UT campuses used off-campus locations sparingly, with all other campuses accounting for just 5 of the 27 off-campus locations. Roane State and Volunteer State community colleges operated the most community college off-campus locations in fall 2011, with 43 and 41 locations, respectively.

Summary

Off-campus locations continue to serve an integral purpose in Tennessee's higher education system. The combination of sites and centers provides educational opportunities for dual enrollment classes, offers courses that cannot pragmatically be delivered on a traditional campus, and broadens the geographic presence of higher education to make it more accessible for students who find it difficult to attend a main campus location. In particular, part-time students, more likely to be non-traditional, represent a growing proportion of higher education enrollees taking advantage of locations outside the main campuses of Tennessee's educational institutions. The increase in Tennessee technological center and community college off-campus locations and enrollment further indicates that off-campus locations serve a supplemental purpose of providing continuing education necessary for skill-set growth required by occupational development.

Chart 1. Off-Campus Locations Fall 2006 – Fall 2011


