



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
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OVERVIEW OF REPORT



This report is prepared pursuant to T.C.A. §49-4-903(b), which directs the Tennessee Higher Education Commission (THEC) to:


“...provide assistance to the general assembly and to the Tennessee Student Assistance Corporation (TSAC) by researching and analyzing data concerning the scholarship and grant programs created under this part, including, but not limited to, student success and scholarship renewal.”

The Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarship (TELS) program was designed to meet the unique needs of the state of Tennessee while also incorporating the hallmark elements of existing merit-based aid programs in other states. Developed through a process involving elected officials and members of the academic community, the TELS program aims to address the following broad public policy objectives:

- Improve academic achievement in high school through scholarship incentive (GAMS, HOPE, ASPIRE);
- Provide financial assistance as a means of promoting access to higher education (ASPIRE, Access);
- Retain the state’s “best and brightest” students in Tennessee colleges and universities (GAMS); and
- Enhance and promote economic and community development through workforce training (Wilder-Naifeh).

The Tennessee Education Lottery began operations on January 20, 2004. Lottery proceeds fund scholarships for Tennessee students attending eligible public or private institutions and universities across the state. Initial qualification and renewal criteria for the program were set in 2003. The legislature adjusted the qualification criteria in 2005 and the renewal criteria in 2008. Additionally, the legislature added a Non-traditional Student Grant and Dual Enrollment Grant in 2005 and several smaller provisions in 2006 and 2008. Finally, lottery scholarship coverage for summer school enrollments of six credit hours or more began in summer 2012 for students who first received the scholarship in fall 2009 or after.

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
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
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Technical Notes & Definitions



- All data contained within this report are from the Tennessee Higher Education Commission’s (THEC) Student Information System (SIS), as reported to the Commission by institutions through their respective governing board or association.
- Data for Vanderbilt University are excluded or incomplete due to data submission issues.
- Students are identified by higher education sector and scholarship type at college entry.
- Students with inadmissible or missing data values are reported in the Unknown category.
- Unless otherwise noted, all tables and figures include TBR Universities, TBR Community Colleges, UT Campuses, and Private Institutions, and HOPE, GAMS, ASPIRE, and Access programs.
- When Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarship (TELS) students are compared to the general student population (e.g., in Section 6), the general population refers to public institutions only because THEC data on private institutions are limited to TELS recipients.
- The “6-year graduation rate” is defined as the percent of TELS first-time freshmen who attained either an associate’s or bachelor’s degree, whichever is higher, within six years of enrollment regardless of scholarship status at graduation.
- The “graduation rate with TELS intact” is defined as the percent of TELS first-time freshmen who attained either an associate’s or bachelor’s degree, whichever is highest, within five years of enrollment without losing scholarship eligibility (having the scholarship intact in the fall semester prior to graduation). Five years is chosen for this statistic because that is the maximum number of years for which students can renew a scholarship.
- Renewal, Retention, and Graduation rates are attributed to the higher education sector and scholarship type at college entry.
- Percentages may not add to 100 percent due to rounding.

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Program Overview

- Since the Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarship (TELS) program began operation in 2004-05, the program costs and the number of students served have more than doubled from over 40,000 students and \$93 million in 2004-05 to over 100,000 students and nearly \$300 million in 2010-11 (**Table 4**).
- In addition to the growth in the number of students and dollars, the program has also experienced numerous changes due to legislation (**Table 2**).
- At its peak, the maximum HOPE award covered 78 percent of average tuition and fees at a public 4-year institution and 77 percent at a public 2-year institution in 2006-07. In 2011-12, the maximum HOPE award, excluding summer, covered 57 percent of average tuition and fees at both public four-year and two-year institutions (**Table 5 & Figure 2**).
- In the fall of 2011, the percentage of eligible first-time freshmen (FTF) receiving a TELS award reached a high of 68 percent (**Table 9 & Figure 5**).
- Since 2008, the proportion of TELS FTF that have qualified for the base HOPE award has declined, while the proportion qualifying for ASPIRE has increased (**Table 8 & Figure 4**). To qualify for the ASPIRE supplemental award a student must have an adjusted gross income of \$36,000 or less. This shift is likely related to the economic recession.

Recipient Demographics

- Since 2010, there has been an increase in the proportion of TELS FTF that identified as an ethnicity other than Caucasian or African American (**Table 11 & Figure 6**). These shifts are likely tied to the new federal race/ethnicity reporting guidelines, and may not represent a substantive shift in the demographics of FTF TELS recipients.
- Since 2004, there has been a shift in the family income profile of TELS FTF. While the proportion of scholarship recipients with a family adjusted gross income (AGI) below

\$36,000 was the same in 2011 as it was in 2004, the proportion with a family AGI above \$96,000 has increased by 5 percentage points (**Table 12 & Figure 7**).

- The proportion of African American TELS FTF eligible for a Pell grant has increased from 59 percent to 76 percent from fall 2004 to fall 2011, compared to an increase from 27 percent to 40 percent for Caucasian students (**Table 20**).
- While the median family AGI of TELS FTF has declined across all ethnicities the difference between the highest (Caucasian) and lowest (African American) median family AGI by ethnicity has increased over the same period (**Table 14 & Figure 8**).
- Almost twice as many TELS FTF Caucasian students (62 percent) qualify for a HOPE or ASPIRE award by meeting both eligibility criteria (3.0 high school GPA and 21 ACT), as African American (33 percent) FTF (**Figure 10**). As is shown in Section 3: Scholarship Renewal, students that met both eligibility criteria have renewal rates higher than students that met only one of the eligibility criteria.
- Less than four percent of TELS FTF were enrolled part-time in fall 2011 (**Table 19**).

Scholarship Renewal

- 56 percent of 2010 TELS FTF retained their scholarship in the fall of 2011 (**Table 24 & Figure 11**).
- Since 2004, the UT system's 1-year renewal rate has increased 11 percentage points from 59 percent to 70 percent, almost two times the increase of any other system [TBR Universities - three percentage points; TBR Community Colleges – two percentage points; Private Institutions – six percentage points] (**Figure 11**).
- In fall 2011, 67 percent of fall 2010 HOPE and ASPIRE FTF that met both eligibility criteria renewed their award for their sophomore year compared to 45 percent that qualified on GPA alone and 31 percent for those that qualified on ACT alone (**Figure 9 & Figure 12**).
- There is a positive correlation between students' AGI and their 1-year renewal rate, with students with higher AGIs having higher renewal rates (**Table 27**).


- Scholarship renewal rates are 22 percentage points higher for recipients that do not need remedial or developmental coursework (**Table 29**).
- ACCESS recipients have the lowest renewal rates; however, the eligibility requirements for an ACCESS award are less stringent and the award amount is less (**Figure 12**).

Retention

- 62 percent of fall 2010 TELS FTF that lost the award returned to college for their sophomore year (**Table 35 & Figure 14**).
- Aside from the base HOPE scholarship program, the percent of TELS FTF that lost the award and returned to college for their sophomore year has increased for the fall 2010 FTF cohort compared to the fall 2004 FTF cohort for all scholarship programs (**Table 36 & Figure 15**).
- 75 percent of African American 2010 TELS FTF returned for their sophomore year after losing their TELS scholarship compared with 64 percent of Caucasian 2010 TELS FTF (**Table 38**).
- With the exception of students with a family adjusted gross income of \$72,000 or more, fall 2010 non-renewers returned to college in the fall of 2011 at about the same rate regardless of their family income (**Table 39**).
- HOPE and ASPIRE TELS recipients that lose their award return to college for their sophomore year at nearly the same rate regardless of the eligibility criteria they initially met, although these rates have dropped over time (**Table 40 & Figure 16**).
- Fall to fall cohort scholarship renewal and retention rates have remained fairly stable across all cohorts (**Table 55**).
- Regardless of whether or not TELS FTF retained their TELS scholarship after their freshmen year, 80 percent return for their sophomore year of college. Almost 75 percent of the original freshmen cohort returned for their junior year and over two-thirds returned for their senior year (**Table 55**).

Graduation

- The 6-year graduation rate for 2005 TELS FTF, regardless of whether they kept the scholarship intact, was 59.7 percent, up from 55.2 percent for the 2004 TELS FTF cohort (**Table 47**).
- Over 85 percent of 2005 TELS FTF that qualified for a GAMS scholarship graduated within 6-years with or without the scholarship intact compared with 62 percent for HOPE recipients, 49 percent for ASPIRE recipients, and 27 percent for ACCESS recipients (**Table 52 & Figure 21**).
- For the fall 2005 TELS FTF cohort, Caucasian students (60.7 percent) had a higher 6-year graduation rate than African American students (52.4 percent) by eight percentage points. However, the gap between the two ethnicity groups has decreased due to the growth in African Americans' 6-year graduation rates (**Table 54**).
- 2005 HOPE and ASPIRE FTF's 6-year graduation rate (with or without the scholarship intact) for students that met both eligibility criteria (68 percent) was higher than for students that met the GPA only requirement (52 percent) and students that met only the ACT criterion (40 percent) (**Figure 22**).
- Graduation rates, with and without the scholarship intact, have remained fairly stable across all cohorts (**Table 55**).
- Only about a quarter of FTF TELS recipients graduated within 4-years with or without the scholarship intact (**Table 55**).
- Half of 2006 TELS FTF graduated within 5-years, but only 35 percent did so with the scholarship intact (**Table 55 & Figure 23**).
- For the 2005 TELS FTF cohort, there is a positive correlation between students' AGI and their longitudinal renewal and graduation rates, with students with higher AGIs having higher renewal and graduation rates (**Table 57**).



Section 1: Program Overview

Program Overview: Key Findings

- Since the Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarship (TELS) program began operation in 2004-05, the program costs and the number of students served have more than doubled from over 40,000 students and \$93 million in 2004-05 to over 100,000 students and nearly \$300 million in 2010-11 (**Table 4**).
- The Lottery for Education Reserve account, which grew to a high of \$471 million in 2007-08, declined to \$365.8 million in 2010-11. The largest contributor to this decline was a \$77 million dollar transfer to an Energy Efficient Schools initiative in FY 2008-09 (**Table 3 & Figure 1**).
- In addition to the growth in the number of students and dollars, the program has also experienced numerous changes due to legislation (**Table 2**).
- At its peak, the maximum HOPE award covered 78 percent of average tuition and fees at a public four-year institution and 77 percent at a public two-year institution in 2006-07. In 2011-12, the maximum HOPE award, excluding summer, covered 57 percent of average tuition and fees at both public four-year and two-year institutions (**Table 5 & Figure 2**).
- In the fall of 2011, the percentage of eligible first-time freshmen (FTF) receiving a TELS scholarship reached a high of 68 percent (**Table 9 & Figure 5**).
- The distribution of TELS FTF receiving a scholarship by postsecondary system has remained relatively constant over time (**Table 8 & Figure 3**).
- Since 2008, the proportion of TELS first-time freshmen receiving the base HOPE award has declined, while the proportion qualifying for ASPIRE has increased (**Table 8 & Figure 4**). To qualify for the ASPIRE supplemental award a student must have an adjusted gross income of \$36,000 or less. This shift is likely related to the economic recession.









Fall 2004 - Fall 2011







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Section 2: Recipient Demographics

Recipient Demographics: Key Findings

- 56 percent of TELS first-time freshmen (FTF) in fall of 2011 were female (Table 11). These proportions have remained stable since the program's inception.
- Since 2010, there has been an increase in the proportion of TELS FTF that identified as an ethnicity other than Caucasian or African American (**Table 11 & Figure 6**). These shifts are likely tied to the new federal race/ethnicity reporting guidelines, and may not represent a substantive shift in the demographics of FTF TELS recipients.
- Since 2004, there has been a shift in the family income profile of TELS FTF. While the proportion of scholarship recipients with a family adjusted gross income (AGI) below \$36,000 was the same in 2011 as it was in 2004, the proportion with a family AGI above \$96,000 has increased by five percentage points (**Table 12 & Figure 7**).
- With the exception of GAMS, the median AGI of TELS FTF has declined across all scholarship programs, in constant 2011 dollars (**Table 13**).
- While the median family AGI of TELS FTF has declined across all ethnicities the difference between the highest (Caucasian) and lowest (African American) median family AGI by ethnicity has increased (**Table 14 & Figure 8**).
- Almost twice as many TELS FTF Caucasian students (62 percent) qualify for a HOPE or ASPIRE award by meeting both eligibility criteria (3.0 high school GPA and 21 ACT), as African American (33%) FTF (**Figure 10**). As is shown in Section 3: Scholarship Renewal, students that met both eligibility criteria have renewal rates higher than students that met only one of the eligibility criteria.
- Less than four percent of TELS FTF were enrolled part-time in fall 2011 (**Table 19**).
- The proportion of African American TELS FTF eligible for a Pell grant has increased from 59 percent to 76 percent from fall 2004 to fall 2011, compared to an increase from 27 percent to 40 percent for Caucasian students (**Table 20**).
- Over a third (39 percent) of TELS FTF in fall 2011 were first generation college students (**Table 22**).



First-time Freshmen Lottery Scholarship Receipt by Ethnicity, Fall 2004 - Fall 2011









Initial Qualifications Met and System, Fall 2011







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Section 3: Scholarship Renewal

Renewal Requirements

TELS recipients are evaluated for scholarship renewal at every 24 attempted credit hours in college. At the 24- and 48-hour check points, students must maintain a minimum cumulative 2.75 college GPA to maintain scholarship eligibility. Upon accumulating 72 credit hours, a minimum cumulative 3.0 college GPA is required to keep scholarship eligibility; this continues at every subsequent 24 credit hours up to 120 credit hours. Limited to those with 72 credit hours or above, state law also allows students to maintain eligibility even if their cumulative GPA was less than 3.0, as long as they:

- have maintained a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.75;
- have earned a semester grade point average of at least 3.0 for the semester in which continuing eligibility was reviewed;
- have enrolled full-time in the semester when continuing eligibility was reviewed; and
- will enroll full-time in the subsequent semester.
- This is referred to as “provisional” renewal.

The award is available for up to five years, baccalaureate degree attainment, or 120 cumulative attempted credit hours, whichever comes first. The 120 hour cap is applicable only to students who first received TELS in Fall 2009 and after. Students in a program requiring more than 120 credit hours for completion are exempted from the 120 hour cap. They can receive a scholarship until they have attempted the number of hours required to earn the degree, but no more than 136 credit hours.

Scholarship Renewal: Key Findings

- 56 percent of 2010 TELS first-time freshmen (FTF) retained their scholarship in the fall of 2011 (**Table 24 & Figure 11**).
- For the fall 2010 TELS FTF cohort, UT campuses' 1-year renewal rate (70 percent) was higher than the rate for private institutions (61 percent) and TBR Universities (52 percent). The private college rate does not include TELS students that attended Vanderbilt (**Table 24 & Figure 11**).
- Since 2004, the UT system's 1-year renewal rate has increased 11 percentage points from 59 percent to 70 percent, almost two times the increase of any other system [TBR Universities - three percentage points; TBR Community Colleges – two percentage points; Private Institutions – six percentage points] (**Figure 11**).
- In fall 2011, 67 percent of fall 2010 HOPE and ASPIRE FTF that met both eligibility criteria renewed their award for their sophomore year compared to 45 percent that qualify on GPA alone and 31 percent for those that qualified on ACT alone (**Figure 9 & Figure 12**).
- There is a positive correlation between students' adjusted gross income (AGI) and their 1-year renewal rate, with students with higher AGIs having higher renewal rates (**Table 27**).
- Scholarship renewal rates are 22 percentage points higher for recipients that do not need remedial or developmental coursework (**Table 29**).
- ACCESS recipients have the lowest renewal rates; however, the eligibility requirements for an ACCESS award are less stringent and the award amount is less (**Figure 12**).

Fall 2004 - Fall 2010 TELS First-time Freshmen







Section 4: College Retention for Scholarship Non-Renewals

Retention for Non-Renewals: Key Findings


- 62 percent of fall 2010 TELS first-time freshmen (FTF) that lost the award returned to college for their sophomore year (**Table 35 & Figure 14**).
- The rate of fall 2010 FTF that lost the award but returned to college for their sophomore year was similar at UT Campuses (72 percent) and TBR Universities (67 percent), while the rate at community colleges was 50 percent (**Table 35 & Figure 14**).
- Aside from the base HOPE scholarship program, the percent of TELS FTF that lost the award and returned to college for their sophomore year has increased for the fall 2010 FTF cohort compared to the fall 2004 FTF cohort for all scholarship programs (**Table 36 & Figure 15**).
- The percent of female and male TELS FTF that returned for their sophomore year after losing their TELS scholarship was virtually identical (**Table 37**).
- 75 percent of African American 2010 TELS FTF returned for their sophomore year after losing their TELS scholarship compared with 64 percent of Caucasian 2010 TELS FTF (**Table 38**).
- With the exception of students with a family adjusted gross income of \$72,000 or more, fall 2010 non-renewers returned to college in the fall of 2011 at about the same rate regardless of their family income (**Table 39**).
- HOPE and ASPIRE TELS recipients that lose their award return to college for their sophomore year at nearly the same rate regardless of the eligibility criteria they initially met, although these rates have dropped over time (**Table 40 & Figure 16**).







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Section 5: 5-year Graduation Rates with TELS Intact

5-year Grad Rates w/TELS Intact: Key Findings

- 35.3 percent of 2006 TELS FTF graduated in 5-years with the scholarship intact (**Table 41 & Figure 17**).
- By system, 46 percent of the 2006 TELS FTF graduated in 5-years with the scholarship intact at Private Institutions compared with 43 percent at UT campuses, 32 percent at TBR Universities, and 24 percent at TBR Community Colleges (**Table 41 & Figure 17**).
- GAMS students' graduation rate (79 percent) with the scholarship intact is double the intact graduation rate of other scholarship programs for the fall 2006 FTF cohort (**Table 42 & Figure 18**).
- 39.2 percent of 2006 female TELS FTF graduated in 5-years with the scholarship intact compared to 30.2 percent for 2006 male TELS FTF (**Table 43**).
- 37.5 percent of 2006 Caucasian TELS FTF graduated in 5-years with the scholarship intact compared to 19.1 percent for African American TELS FTF (**Table 44**).
- 2006 TELS FTF that met both eligibility criteria have a graduation rate that is over twice as high as TELS FTF that qualified based on their GPA or ACT score alone (**Table 45 & Figure 19**).

Fall 2004 - Fall 2006 TELS First-time Freshmen Cohorts



Fall 2004 - Fall 2006 TELS First-time Freshmen Cohorts







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Section 6: 6-year Graduation Rates for TELS Recipients

6-year Graduation Rates: Key Findings

- The 6-year graduation rate for 2005 TELS first-time freshmen (FTF), regardless if they kept the scholarship intact, was 59.7 percent, up from 55.2 percent for the 2004 TELS FTF cohort (**Table 47**).
- By system, the 6-year graduation rates for 2005 TELS first-time freshmen were: UT Campuses – 63 percent, TBR Universities – 47 percent, TBR Community Colleges – 26 percent, and Private Institutions – 68 percent (**Table 51 & Figure 20**).
- Over 85 percent of 2005 TELS FTF that qualified for a GAMS award graduated within 6-years with or without the scholarship intact compared with 62 percent for HOPE recipients, 49 percent for ASPIRE recipients, and 27 percent for ACCESS recipients (**Table 52 & Figure 21**).
- While the graduation rates for both genders increased four percentage points from the 2004 TELS FTF cohort to the 2005 TELS FTF cohort, a seven percentage point gap between the groups remains (**Table 53**).
- For the fall 2005 TELS FTF cohort, Caucasian students (60.7 percent) had a higher 6-year graduation rate than African American students (52.4 percent) by eight percentage points. However, the gap between the two ethnicity groups has decreased due to the growth in African Americans' 6-year graduation rates (**Table 54**).
- 2005 HOPE and ASPIRE FTF's 6-year graduation rate (with or without the scholarship intact) for students that met both eligibility (68 percent) was higher than students that met only the GPA requirement (52 percent) and students that met only the ACT criterion(40 percent) (**Figure 22**).



Fall 2004 and Fall 2005 Cohorts







Section 7: Longitudinal Renewal, Retention, and Graduation Rates

Longitudinal Renewal, Retention, and Graduation Rates: Key Findings


- Fall to fall cohort scholarship renewal and retention rates, as well as graduation rates, have remained fairly stable across all cohorts (**Table 55**).
- Regardless of whether or not TELS first-time freshmen (FTF) retained their TELS scholarship after their freshmen year, 80 percent return for their sophomore year of college. Almost 75 percent return for their junior year and over two-thirds return for their senior year (**Table 55**).
- Only about a quarter of FTF TELS recipients graduated within 4-years with or without the scholarship intact (**Table 55**).
- Half of 2006 TELS FTF graduated within 5-years, but only 35 percent did so with the scholarship intact (**Table 55 & Figure 23**).
- For the 2005 TELS FTF cohort, there is a positive correlation between students' adjusted gross income (AGI) and their longitudinal renewal and graduation rates, with students with higher AGIs having higher renewal and graduation rates (**Table 57**).


