

REQUEST FOR APPLICATIONS INFORMAL SOLICITATION FOR INCLUSIVE FACILITY GRANTS WITH

TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

I. STATEMENT OF INTENT:

The State of Tennessee, Department of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities, hereinafter referred to as the Department, intends to award grants for the FY 2024. These funds are to be awarded to government entities and 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations across the state on a competitive basis for the purpose of creating inclusive parks, playgrounds, and other facilities for children and adults who have intellectual and developmental disabilities. The maximum amount awarded for each grant shall be \$500.000.

II. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS:

D. Grant Duration:

The Department intends to distribute the grants one-time as non-recurring funds to each recipient during fiscal year 2024 (July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024).

*Subject to change dependent on applications received.

E. Funds Available:

Each grantee will be awarded a maximum of \$500,000 from the Department of Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities to be used for the purposes of creating inclusive parks, playgrounds, and other facilities for children and adults who have intellectual or developmental disabilities. The State has a maximum total allocation of \$2,500,000.00 for Inclusive Facilities.

Funds will be distributed as cost are incurred by the Grantee in keeping with the cost reimbursement format.

F. Grantee Selection:

The Applications will be collected and evaluated based on the top scores and funding availability.

III. SCOPE OF SERVICES REQUESTED:

A. Services to be Provided or Procured:

B. Primary Focus of the Inclusive Facility Grant:

The primary focus of the grant is to create inclusive parks and playgrounds across the state of Tennessee for children and adults who have intellectual and developmental disabilities.

IV. GRANT APPLICATION FORMAT:

- A. The grant application must address all portions of this Notice as set forth herein; however, proposers may retype and/or duplicate the forms for grant application submission, provided the revised format remains in order prescribed and addresses all of the Department's required information which appears in the Department's prepared forms.
- B. The Department reserves the right to request clarification or corrections to grant applications, to reject any and all grant applications or to cancel this Notice in its entirety at the Department's sole discretion. Any grant application received which does not meet these General Instructions may be considered to be "Non-Responsive" and the grant application may be rejected. Any rejection or acceptance of applications is at the sole discretion of the Department.
- C. The Department reserves the right to further clarify and/or negotiate with the best evaluated grant applications, subsequent to award recommendation but prior to contract execution, if such is deemed necessary at the discretion of the Department.

V. MODIFICATIONS FOR GRANT:



Any and all changes made to an awarded grant must be submitted to DIDD for approval prior to implementing changes.

VI. SUBJECT TO FUNDS AVAILABILITY:

The award of a grant contract under this Grant Application is subject to the appropriation and availability of State and/or Federal funds.

Each successful grantee must include, as a part of its grant application, a method for assuring the ability of their playground, park, or other facility to include people with and without disabilities alike into the activities that take place there.

Create a list of positions that will be necessary to oversee this playground, park, or facility. This list should include hourly pay rates along with the number of hours each position is expected to work.
