SECTION 2. DEFINITION OF PERSONAL INTEREST.

- (1) For purposes of Section 3 and 4, "personal interest" means:
- (a) Any financial, ownership, or employment interest in the particular entity or person that is the subject of a vote by a municipal board not otherwise regulated by state statutes on conflicts of interests; or
- (b) Any financial, ownership, or employment interest in the entity or person to be regulated or supervised; or
- (c)Any such financial, ownership, or employment interest of the official's or employee's spouse, parent(s), stepparent(s), grandparents(s), sibling(s), child(ren), or stepchild(ren).

- An official or employee may not use or disclose information obtained in his official capacity or position of employment with the intent to result in financial gain for himself or any other person

SECTION 7. USE OF MUNICIPAL TIME, FACILITIES, ETC.

- (1) An official or employee may not use or authorize the use of municipal time, facilities, equipment, or supplies for private gain or advantage to himself.
- (2) An official or employee may not use or authorize the use of municipal time, facilities, authorized by legitimate contract or lease that is determined by the governing body to be in the equipment, or supplies for private gain or advantage to any private person or entity, except as best interests of the municipality.

SECTION 8. USE OF POSITION OR AUTHORITY.

- (1) An official or employee may not make or attempt to make private purchases, for cash or otherwise, in the name of the municipality.
- (2) An official or employee may not use or attempt to use his position to secure any privilege or exemption for himself or others that is not authorized by the charter, general law, or ordinance or policy of the municipality.
