

THE CERTIFICATE NUMBER WHICH APPEARS ON YOUR PLASTIC CARD MUST BE DISPLAYED ON YOUR BOAT AS SHOWN BELOW. THE NUMBERS AND LETTERS MUST BE BLOCK STYLE AT LEAST 3 INCHES HIGH, OF CONTRASTING COLOR TO THE HULL, WITH SPACES BETWEEN TN AND NUMBERS AND LETTERS.

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
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Tennessee Requirements For Recreational Boats

Additional requirements can be found in the pamphlet "Tennessee Boating"



REGISTRATION

Required for sailboats and all mechanically powered vessels (also documented vessels). Number must be permanently attached or painted on the bow, read left to right. Example: TN 0000 AA; number not less than 3 inches in height. Block style numbers and letters.

IDENTIFICATION DECAL

A validation decal must be affixed to the vessel on each side of the bow (the forward half of the vessel), either preceding or following the TN identification number. For documented vessels, please see below.

DOCUMENTED VESSELS

Documented vessels are those vessels that are five tons or larger and are issued a federal document (title) by the U.S. Coast Guard. The vessel must also be registered with the State of Tennessee but is not required to display the registration number. However, a validation decal must be displayed on either side of the vessel on the windows located nearest the main operator station. Documented sailboats, in lieu of that location, may place the decal on the bottom of the main mast, on both the right and left sides.

PERSONAL WATERCRAFT

All boating laws apply to PWC. Must wear life jacket at all times. May not operate between sunset and sunrise.

REGULATIONS

No Wake Areas

Areas within 300' of a commercial dock and other areas as posted.

Owner Responsibility

A vessel, used with the owner's consent, is liable for any injury or damage caused by the negligent operation of the vessel, even if owner is not present

Reckless Operation

\$2,500 fine plus 11 months and 29 days in jail for any act that endangers life, limb, property. (Examples: operating under the influence of alcohol or drugs; operating in swimming areas; riding on seatbacks, gunwhales or transoms.)

Boating Accident Reports

Immediate notification to TWRA of any reportable boating accident. A reportable boating accident is any boating incident that involves death, missing person, injury beyond first aid or \$2,000 in property damage.

Skiina

All skiers must wear an adequate flotation device. Boats towing skiers must be equipped with a wide-angle mirror or have an observer of at least 12 years of age. If a Coast Guard approved life jacket is not worn by the skier, then one must be on board the towing vessel.

Lighting

All boats operating between sunset and sunrise and during periods of restricted visibility are required to display the appropriate lights. An anchored vessel must display an anchor light, which is an all-around, white light, visible for two miles.

Life Jacket

All children 12 years of age and under must wear a life jacket at all times while on a boat underway. (Drifting is considered underway.)

MANDATORY BOATER EDUCATION

Any Tennessee resident born after 1/1/1989 must have obtained a TWRA-issued, wallet-size boating education certificate as proof of passing a monitored exam administered by a representative of TWRA. For exam locations and times, log onto www.tnwildlife.org.

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
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
