## (Bethsy Harrigan)

- National Down Syndrome Awareness Month "DSAM" This month is a time to celebrate the abilities and achievements of people with Down Syndrome. Down Syndrome occurs across the human spectrum and is the most common chromosomal condition. Each year, about 6,000 babies are born with Down Syndrome, a 1 in 700 chance. The prevalence of Down Syndrome increases with the mother's age, which is associated with delays in physical growth, characteristic facial features, and intellectual disability. These are just facts, and like all facts, they can fail to provide a full picture. The truth is children born with Down Syndrome, can go on to live happy and long lives.
- National Spina Bifida Awareness Month this is a birth defect in which there is incomplete closing of the spine and the membranes around the spinal cord during early development in pregnancy. No one knows for sure what causes Spina Bifida, but experts think that both genetics and environmental factors interact to cause Spina Bifida. There is no way to prevent a baby from having a birth defect, the only possibility is to reduce the risk. Studies show the risk is reduced up to 70 percent when women take folic acid at least one month before and through the first three months of pregnancy. However, it's important to note that folic acid does not prevent all cases of Spina Bifida.

Any woman who can become pregnant can have a baby with Spina Bifida. Although people with a first-degree relative (parent, sibling) with Spina Bifida are more likely to have a child with Spina Bifida, there is no way to tell which women will have babies with an affected pregnancy. Experts know that genes play a role, and they are looking for the exact gene(s) that cause Spina Bifida. In time, research should clearly show how Spina Bifida develops so new treatments or even a cure can be developed. This research may also lead to new tests that help people or couples understand their chance of having a baby with Spina Bifida.

• Sudden Infant Death Syndrome Awareness Month (SIDS) is the term used to describe the sudden death of a baby younger than (1) year of age that doesn't have a known cause, even after a full investigation. The investigation includes a complete autopsy, examining the death scene, and reviewing the clinical history. If they cannot determine a cause of death for the baby or explain why the baby died, the medical examiner or coroner may categorize the death as SIDS.

Researchers do not know exactly what causes SIDS. However, they do have a theory, that may explain how SIDS happens and it's called the Triple-Risk Model, which is known as unknown the baby medical conditions, period of development and outside stressors.

By itself, each risk is usually not a problem because most babies can adjust to stresses and changes as their body system functions and recover from these factors if they occur alone or even two at a time. However, when all three occur at the same time, a death from SIDS becomes more likely.

## Member Comments: Announcements and Upcoming Events

• Medicare Open Enrollment began on October 15, 2023, and ends December 7, 2023, with coverage changes taking effect January 1, 2024. During this time, people with Medicare can compare coverage options, like Traditional Medicare and Medicare Advantage, and choose health and drug plans for 2024. Medicare Advantage and Part D plan costs and covered benefits can change from year to year, so people with Medicare should look at their coverage choices and decide on the options that best meet their health needs.

Here are four ways people with Medicare can compare plans and look at savings options:

- 1. Go to <u>Medicare.gov</u> to learn the difference between Traditional Medicare and Medicare Advantage, and do sideby-side comparisons of costs and coverage for Medicare Advantage and prescription drug plans.
- 2. Call 1-800-MEDICARE. Help is available 24 hours a day, including weekends.
- 3. Access personalized health insurance counseling at no cost, available from State Health Insurance Assistance Programs (SHIP). Visit <a href="mailto:shiphelp.org">shiphelp.org</a> or call 1-800-MEDICARE for each SHIP's phone number. Many SHIPs also offer virtual counseling.
- 4. Check eligibility for the Medicare Savings Programs and the Part D Low-Income Subsidy Program. If you have limited income and resources, you could qualify for Medicare Savings Programs, run by your state Medicaid program, or for the Part D Low-Income Subsidy Program. These programs could help save you money on health and prescription drug costs and could reduce your Part B premium and/or Part D premium to \$0. 
