TOPICS OF DISCUSSION

Focus: Maternal Mortality Review Program: 2023 Annual Report Findings

Summary: The findings in this report were made possible by the Multi-Disciplinary Maternal Mortality Review Committee Chair, Co-Chairs, Epidemiologists, and Nurse Abstractors. The Tennessee Maternal Mortality Review Act of 2016 was established by the Tennessee Maternal Mortality Review Committee also known as MMRC. The interdisciplinary committee reviews, every death to improve the health of women before, during and after pregnancy, plus they contribute annual recommendations in such like reports. The first report was created in 2017 and as of today we're in our fifth year of MMRC.

The Tennessee Nonterminal Mortality Review Committee reviews all deaths during pregnancy, records are collected from multiple sources and relevant information is abstracted by the Nurse Abstractors which then is presented to the committee. There are categories of maternal mortality which specify the timing, cause of death and pregnancy deaths related to pregnancy and deaths not related to pregnancy. Pregnancy related deaths were highest among non-Hispanic black women covered by ten (10) women residing in West Tennessee and the three leading causes of death were noted as COVID-19, cardiovascular disease, and substance abuse disorder.

The Maternal Mortality Review Committee recommends the COVID-19 vaccine should be offered to all pregnant women, per CDC guidelines, and providers should be aware of the improved outcomes with the use of early ECMO which is an advanced form of life support in young patients with COVID-19, during pregnancy. From 2017 to 2021, cardiovascular deaths remain the leading cause of pregnancy related deaths almost half of all cardiovascular deaths, were due to preeclampsia eclampsia, followed by cardiomyopathy and other causes of cardiovascular death such as conduction defects, arrhythmias, valvular heart disease and hypertensive cardiovascular disease. The highest risk group was non-Hispanic black women between the ages of 30 and 39 years.

The Maternal Mortality Review Program also have success stories which are they were able to fund community grants to implement Maternal Mortality Review Committee recommendations such as TennCare expanded healthcare benefits for pregnancy and postpartum to TennCare members. Tennessee was authorized the creation of a Doula Service Advisory Committee and the MMR Program is now able to conduct interview to family members, that request voluntary participation to gain a better understanding surrounding the death of the mom. MMR continues to have a collaboration with TDH which partners with TIPQC and THA. In the year 2022 the MMR Program incorporated hospital discharge data services for case identification of pregnancy associated deaths.
