## Syndromic Surveillance Messaging Declaration of Readiness Revision

The Communicable and Environmental Disease and Emergency Preparedness Section (CEDEP) within the Tennessee Department of Health (TDH) has revised its declaration of readiness for Syndromic Surveillance Reporting regarding the submission of syndromic surveillance data from eligible clinicians (ECs) and eligible professionals (EPs) in urgent care settings. Effective January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022, TDH will accept registrations from ECs and EPs.

Due to limited resource capacity TDH is limiting electronic reporting to eligible hospitals (w/ emergency department) and ECs/EPs practicing in an urgent care facility.

ECs and EPs not meeting the requirements above may be excluded from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) electronic Syndromic Surveillance Reporting measure. Please visit CMS' <u>Promoting Interoperability Programs site</u> for more information.
