TOPICS OF DISCUSSION

Focus: Introduction to Multiple Myeloma Research Foundation (MMRF)

Presenter: Dr. Ola Banjo

Summary: The information, Dr. Banjo provided today was about Multiple Myeloma Research Foundation known as MMRF, which is **the** largest nonprofit foundation in the world. MMRF is focused on increasing the cure for multiple myeloma with leadership, partnerships, and collaborations that serve patients with multiple myeloma. Their approach brings awareness to the disease and provides educational material for the patients.

Multiple Myeloma is a blood cancer disease developed in the bone marrow, which is a soft spongy tissue found in the center of many bones, where blood cells are produced. This disease causes bone pain in the chest, spine and brings on fatigue, nausea, constipation, frequent infections, and weight loss. Multiple Myeloma discharges a liquid substance which restricts the process of bone growth and repair, it's the second most common blood cancer disease, that affects patients of color. Multiple Myeloma patients of color also have symptoms such as low blood,

anemia, weakness, decreased kidney function and bone damage. African American patients are two times more likely to develop multiple myeloma than patients of other races and have a two times higher mortality rate than patients of other races, there's also an earlier age of disease onset, multiple myeloma is a disease that is seen in patients aged 69 and above. MMRF, really focuses their mission on increasing awareness, due to the disparities that exist in African American descent patients, they notice the treatment options are not the same and under used standard of therapy.

MMRF is a instrumental in making a huge difference in patient's lives, especially in black patients. MMRF seeks for every patient to be a self-advocate and one thing the research has seen is the equal access to standard therapy proven that black patients have equal or superior outcome to white patients. MMRF, helped bring (15) different multiple myeloma drugs on the market, raised \$500M+ for research and opened over (80) clinical trials. MMRF do not perform research, but what they do is fund organizations and academic medical centers and community hospitals, which their work help increases survival rates from (3) years to (10) years.
