TOPICS OF DISCUSSION

Focus: Mr. Trevor C. White, Communication & Training Specialist

Presenter: Office of Reentry Presentation

Summary: Dr. Trevor C. White presentation provided great insight on the Office of Reentry that was created July 2021, which was inspired by Governor Lee's vision of true criminal justice reform, as the nation's first statewide comprehensive non corrections office which means the Office of Reentry is with the Department of Labor, not Department of Corrections. We partner with employers, state agencies, faith-based organizations, and non-profit stakeholders. Our goal is to reduce recidivism through labor, workforce development, which will lead to better opportunities and ultimately better employment. We also hire men and women who lived and experience incarceration and with them being employed they bring us vision from their perspective.

There are key term words that are commonly used such as reentry, which is from life to prison or jail, to life in the community, recidivism an act of continuing to commit crimes and justice involved individuals are those who been currently involved with the justice system. These words are also used for those that are on probation or parole, under home confinement, community residential supervision and incarcerated in jail or prison. A former incarcerated person has a 27% unemployment rate compared to the current unemployment rate for Tennessee which is roughly 3.2%. A good job and supportive services are critical to the Office of Reentry which promotes public safety and improves economic and well-being communities.

To advance the Office of Reentry, we must do it by providing baseline training for reentry staff in various capacities, establishing the office and growing it within the workforce services and lastly repurposing staff at our job centers, which will be our reentry advisors so we can increase the awareness of the office of reentry work through the Department of Labor.
