## **TOPICS OF DISCUSSION**

Focus: Ryan White Part B Program & HIV/STI/Viral Hepatitis Program

**Presenter:** Christopher Walton, Ryan White Part B Program Director of Client Services in the HIV/STI/Viral Hepatitis Program at the Tennessee Department of Health

**Summary:** The Task Force Meeting, today was about the Ryan White Part B Program and the HIV/STI/Viral Hepatitis Program. The providing data being used is from the year 2020, state of Tennessee. There's over 19,000+ individuals living

with HIV in Tennessee alone and there were 651 newly diagnosed cases of (African American and Hispanic male and female) minorities, which they are leading and facing a great amount of health care disparities, we discuss on a regular basis. As of 2020, it is believed that 15% of Tennesseans were walking around not aware they have been affected with the HIV virus, which also means they could be spreading the virus through sex or injection of drug use.

The Ryan White Part B Program serves 9,300 clients and for them to be apart of the program, they must have the following three items, 1) be a resident of Tennessee 2) be diagnosed with HIV or AIDS and 3) their income must fall at or below 400% of the federal poverty level, making less than \$58,000 for a single person. The HIV/STI/Viral Hepatitis Program is a prevention program, promoting school-based health and disease prevention among the youth between the ages of 13-35, strategizing a way to control and most importantly stop the spread of these diseases.

The program works with (33) health departments, hospitals, and community-based organizations across the state of Tennessee and their seeking to partner in areas that we know there's no resources and transportation barriers for those who have the virus. We're working on a campaign called U = U which is strategic strategy to help slow down and try to end the transmission of HIV from one individual to another. Individuals who have HIV and taking their effective medication, have a reduced viral load and their viral load is undetectable, which means they cannot pass HIV on to their sexual partners. This is very important because most of the individuals who get HIV get it through sex but there are others who get it through drug usage.

Due to scientific advances, we've come a long way with medication but we're trying to do more by getting resources and information to as many people as possible to get tested because we want people to understand the importance of taking medication. There's also medication called Prep, which allows individuals who don't have HIV not to get HIV from their positive partner. We need to transform the course of this HIV epidemic quickly, with aggressive knowledge, more preventable strategies, medical care and ways to end the stigma for those that are not receiving treatment at all.
