



A HEALTHY SYSTEM OF CARE: Access

Tennessee statute states that "every citizen should have reasonable access to health care." Access to care can often be limited by insurance status, cost of care, and access to facilities such as rural hospitals.



20,000 children in TN are underinsured.

In Tennessee, 7.7% of children with private insurance do not have coverage for mental or emotional problems, compared to 10.3% in the United States.




A HEALTHY SYSTEM OF CARE: Quality of Care

Hospital Quality

In 2022, 34% of hospitals in Tennessee had the top-quality rating (Grade A) on the Hospital Safety Score compared to 26% in the U.S.





<u>Preventable Hospitalizations in Tennessee</u>


Rate of hospitalizations for ambulatory care-sensitive conditions per 100,000

adults.*

Evidence shows that consistent quality access to primary care should manage ambulatory care-sensitive conditions such as diabetes and asthma, sufficiently to prevent hospitalizations.



2021 Preventable Hospitalization Rate



*COVID-19 has been associated with statistically significant decreases in preventable hospitalizations, particularly respiratory-related preventable hospitalizations such as asthma. Despite these seemingly positive decreases in preventable hospitalizations, the pandemic impacted both patient decision making as well as hospital capacity and data should be interpreted with caution.





A HEALTHY SYSTEM OF CARE: Screenings

Approximately 43,170 Tennesseans will be diagnosed with cancer in 2024, placing Tennessee among the top 10 states with the highest rates of cancer.

Nurses

Rate of active registered nurse (RN) and licensed practical nurse (LPN) licenses per 100,000 persons in Tennessee.

In 2022, Tennessee had 2,031 nurses per 100,000 persons.





Home Health Care
Rate of personal care and home
health aides per 1,000 adults aged
65+ with a disability.

In 2021, Tennessee had less than half the number aides per 1,000 adults aged 65+ with a disability than the U.S.

Palliative Care

Percentage of hospitals providing palliative care programs.

In 2021, 29.4% of Tennessee hospitals provided palliative care programs compared to 39.7% in the United States.


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A HEALTHY SYSTEM OF CARE: Workforce

In February 2024, 93.7% of TN counties were considered Primary Care Health Professional Shortage Areas.




Mental Health Professional Shortage Areas
