


# Suicide Syndromic Surveillance Quarterly Data Brief January – March 2024

### Region/Metro ESSENCE Alerts\*, Children (5-17)




For the 5-17 age group, alerts were primarily concentrated in the rural, West and South Central health regions of the state, as well as Madison and Davidson counties.

### Region/Metro ESSENCE Alerts, Young Adults (18-24)\*




The 18-24 age group saw its alerts concentrated primarily in the Upper Cumberland health region.

### Region/Metro ESSENCE Alerts, Adults (25-44)\*




Madison County was the primary location for alerts in the 25-44 age group and the only area with 5 alerts in 2024 Q1.

### Region/Metro ESSENCE Alerts, Adults Middle Aged (45-64)\*




The 45-64 age group saw the most alerts issued in the Mid-Cumberland and Northeast health regions.

#### Region/Metro ESSENCE Alerts, Older Adults (65+)\*



While the 65+ age group had the least number of alerts issued overall, they were concentrated in the Upper Cumberland and South Central health regions.



Adults (25-44)	Madison	5
Adults Middle-Aged(45-64)	Mid-Cumberland, Northeast	4
Older Adults (65+)	South Central, Upper Cumberland	3

#### **Statewide Change in Suicide Related ER Visits**

Age Group	Total ER Visits	Percent Change in a Quarter
Children (5-17)	2506	-1.3%
Young Adults (18-24)	1678	-3.1%
Adults (25-44)	4189	-0.4%
Adults Middle-Aged (45-64)	2921	+2.3%
Older Adults (65+)	729	+0.8%

#### Highlighted Risk Factors: CY2024 Q1

#### **Risk Factors**

- Children (5-17): Bullying, Family conflict, Sexual violence, Foster care, Child abuse
- Young Adults (18-24): Pregnancy, Pregnancy loss, Previous suicide attempt
- Adults (25-44): Homelessness, Sexual violence, Unable to take prescribed medication due to cost/insurance
- Adults Middle Aged (45-64): Suicide of relative, Loss of job, Chronic pain
- Older Adults (65+): Previous suicide attempt, Alzheimer's, Dementia,
  Death of spouse



#### Highlighted Self-Harm Methods: CY2024 Q1

#### **Intentional Self-Harm and Suicidal Behavior**

- Children (5-17): Cutting and self-mutilation, Overdose on non-prescription medication, Hanging, Cutting, Running out into traffic
- Young Adults (18-24): Overdose on selective serotonin reuptake inhibitors (SSRI), Threats to crash car, Poisoning by toxic substances
- Adults (25-44): Firearms, Burning self
- Adults Middle Aged (45-64): Firearms, Plans / Threats to jump
- Older Adults (65+): Overdose on medication
