75 percent of Tennessee third graders will be proficient in reading by 2025.




The average ACT composite score in Tennessee will be a 21 by 2020.






Grades 3 to 5 ELA TNReady

Student performance on **TNReady** in 2016–17 mirrors the level of readiness demonstrated by Tennessee students on **national tests**.






2017 Achievement Grade 4




Questions and tasks reflect the depth of textual analysis required by grade-level standards and integrate these standards in service of deep understanding of text(s) and topics.

- Summer Camps
- K-3 Unit Starters
- Ready with Resources
- Coaching Network

- Summer Camps
 - Built on last year's statistically significant gains in reading skills and motivation for R2BR Summer Camps with \$8.8 million investment
 - 2018 camps included 7,700 students across Tennessee that were economically disadvantaged and behind in reading proficiency
 - Each child took home at least 10 new books at the end of camp



- K-3 Unit Starters
 - Piloted K-3 ELA unit starters in 18 schools and releasing 18 unit starters that integrate science and social studies for teachers to raise expectations
 - Awarding almost 300 teachers with unit starter text sets for science and social studies




- Ready with Resources
 - Launched Ready with Resources campaign as part of R2BR to support access to high quality resources
 - Support districts through bi-annual regional convenings and CORE outreach
 - Develop teacher champions to promote the use of high quality resources
 - Empower educators, leaders, and decision-makers for ELA textbook adoption and purchase



- Coaching Network
 - Expanded network by adding:
 - 14 districts
 - 140 schools
 - 39 auditing districts
 - 800 teachers
 - 18,000 students

- Intentional focus on three areas:
 - selecting high-quality texts
 - question sequences that meet demands
 - explicit foundation skills tied to tasks





- Literacy Learning Walks
 - CORE engaged in 700+ Literacy Learning Walks with districts across the state
 - Support district leaders in understanding the strengths and gaps in literacy instruction in classrooms
