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**Teaching as a Profession and Foundational Literacy Course Standards**

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**The Background:**

T.C.A. § 49-1-302(a)(8) authorizes the State Board of Education to “set policies governing all academic standards and courses of study in the public schools.” Additionally, State Board Rule 0520-01-03-.05(1) calls for the State Board to adopt standards for each subject area, grades K-12. The approved standards are to be the basis for planning instructional programs in each local school system.

The Tennessee Literacy Success Act (Chapter 3 of the Public Acts of 2021, 1<sup>st</sup> Extraordinary Session) requires the Department to develop a foundational literacy skills instruction course for high school students participating in the Teaching as a Profession (TAP) program of study. Per T.C.A. § 49-1-906(c) the Foundational Literacy Practicum is a new course that will be offered as a Level 4 course for both the Teaching as a Profession (TAP) and Early Childhood Education Careers (ECEC) programs of study within the Education and Training career cluster.

Additionally, the Education and Training career cluster, Teaching as a Profession (TAP) Program of Study, courses have been cross walked with Literacy Standards and EPP standards to ensure alignment. The following courses have recommendations to revise current course standards to integrate elements of Foundational Literacy Skills where appropriate.
