



HOW TO READ THIS REPORT

The Teacher Preparation Report Card contains four (4) domains: Candidate Profile, Employment, Satisfaction, and Provider Impact. Each domain is comprised of multiple metrics. To date, data has not been collected for the Satisfaction domain, so it will be unscored this year. A provider must have at least ten total completers and must generate a score on at least one half of the metrics in each domain in order to generate an overall performance category rating. For more information, please refer to the technical guide.

Providers are awarded a performance category based on their ability to successfully prepare Tennessee educators. This is calculated using the percentage of points earned across all metrics. Category 1 represents the lowest performance, and Category 4 represents the highest performance.

The 2017 Teacher Preparation Report Card will include data on three cohorts of completers (2013-14, 2014-15, and 2015-16). Performance on each metric is displayed in the format shown in the graphic on the right.



Completer Placement Across Tennessee




Tusculum College is a private institution providing bachelors and masters degrees in a Judeo-Christian and civic arts environment. Founded in 1794, Tusculum College is the oldest college in Tennessee and the twenty-eighth oldest college in the nation. The wooded 140-acre Greeneville campus has nine buildings and the Tusculum Arch that are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Tusculum College has been selected by the Carnegie Foundation as a model institution for education that encourages effective citizenship. Educator preparation programs are delivered on a focused calendar of two 8-week blocks per semester with both day and evening program options, allowing students to tailor their schedule to fit their lifestyles and goals. In partnership with local schools, Tusculum College prepares teachers who are committed to excellence in education and are able to assume leadership roles as educators and citizens in the communities where they live and work.


Percent of Total State Completers



Enrollment by Ethnicity




Percent of Completers by State of Residency

Completers by Type of Initial Licensure






