Shelby County Government is requesting the approval to specify the following proprietary items for use on the above referenced project:

- Color admixture for use in Urban Boulders Chromix Admixture with Lithochrome Colormax, French Gray color by Scofield Systems, Douglasville, GA.
- 2. Trail Regulation Sign Panel by Folia Industries, Huntingdon, Quebec, Canada.
- 3. Materials for Greenway gateway signs:
 - a. Arlon 2-mil premium cast vinyl film (colors #02 white and #79 kiwi green).
 - b. Grip-Gard acrylic polyurethane topcoat.
 - c. Matthews Paint colors MP 00561 Lignite; MP LVS202 / PMS 375C; MP 1000170 / PMS 021C; and MP 24508 Skyblue.
- 4. Eco-Counter, Inc. Eco-Combo Logger XGCM0004 for multi-users (pedestrians/bicycles).
- 5. Rainbird Manhole 761 used for the Eco-Counter system.

These items are currently in use at the Shelby Farms Greenline along its existing 10.8 mile corridor, and this request will provide consistency and uniformity for the proposed project that will extend the Greenline an additional 2.15 miles for a total length of almost 13 miles. For Items 1,2, and 3, visual continuity and materials consistency along the entire Greenline is necessary for field maintenance, user expectations and aesthetic conformity. It is important to Shelby County that the Greenline gives an appearance of a single segment without phase lines. For Item 4, the Eco-Counter brand is needed for the bike/pedestrian counters (which track real-time trail use data and transmit the data wirelessly) to be compatible with Eco-Counter software already being used and managed by Shelby Farms Park Conservancy for the existing Greenline and within the 4,000

For Item 5, the Eco-Counter system is specifically designed to be compatible with Rainbird Manhole and there is not an equivalent alternate brand which will be compatible. Shelby Farms currently has several Eco-Counters on the existing Greenline Trail.

Given the reasons above, Shelby County would like to request proprietary certification because the patented proprietary items listed above are essential for synchronization with existing facilities.
