

**MINUTES**  
**TENNESSEE HIGHER EDUCATION COMMISSION**  
**Summer Quarterly Meeting**  
**July 27, 2006, 1:00 p.m. CDT**

The meeting was called to order by Vice Chairman Brad Windley at 1:00.

**Adoption of Agenda**

Dr. Brad Windley welcomed all to the meeting and introduced Dr. MaryLou Apple, newly appointed president of Motlow State Community College. He also recognized Dr. Angelo Volpe, Dr. Roy Nicks, and Dr. John Folger. Dr. Windley then called for a motion to adopt the agenda. Mr. Ransom Jones made a motion to approve the agenda. Katie Winchester seconded the motion; the motion was duly adopted.

**Approval of Minutes, April 20, 2006 and June 28, 2006 Meetings**

Dr. Windley called for a motion to approve the minutes of the April 20, 2006 Commission meeting and the minutes of the June 28, 2006 called Commission meeting as presented. General Wendell Gilbert made the motion which was seconded by Ms. Debby Koch; the motion was duly adopted.

**Executive Director's Report**

Dr. Rhoda was recognized to provide his report. He began by commenting on the work session and welcoming all present. Dr. Rhoda then discussed the recent changes in THEC staff and introduced the newest staff members: Dr. Deborah Boyd, Director of GEAR UP, Gopal Ojha, Lottery Assessment division, Katrina Miller, Policy, Planning, and Research division; Eboni Wiley, Postsecondary School Authorization division, Crystal Collins, Graduate Assistant, Lilia Drovnikova, Graduate Assistant, Flora Craig, East Tennessee GEAR UP representative, Stephanie Bolton, West Tennessee GEAR UP representative, and David Wright, who will join the staff next week as Associate Executive Director of Policy, Planning, and Research. He noted the memorandum of transition that was sent to Commission members prior to the meeting that highlighted the changes in staff responsibilities. Dr. Rhoda recognized Mr. Kevin Steiling from the Attorney General's office who will assist the Commission while Will Burns is on a leave of absence. He highlighted the critical issues THEC has been involved with over the year. He noted that Linda Bradley, along with Katrina Miller, would head

the LeMoyne-Owen College issue to help them become a more viable institution; implementation of GEAR UP; the Delaware cost study; the THEC Sunset review; an Education Summit, called for by the Senate this past session; the Public Health Institute; and the P-16 Math Curriculum Alignment Committee. He then called on Mr. Steiling to update the Commission on *Geier*. He stated there was a joint filing to close the case within the next few weeks and noted that the state was in full compliance. He noted this was a proud accomplishment for the State of Tennessee.

## **Systems' Reports**

### Tennessee Board of Regents

Dr. Charles Manning, Chancellor of the Tennessee Board of Regents, was recognized. Dr. Manning discussed the removal of the federal 50/50 on-line vs. on-campus financial aid funding requirement. He also discussed the authorization of educational organizations to be eligible for giving their students financial aid even though they do not individually offer the courses. He noted that the authorization may create some very good ideas as well as potential for misuse and that Tennessee higher education institutions need to be more aware of such organizations and increase consumer protection.

### University of Tennessee

Dr. John Petersen, President of the University of Tennessee system, was recognized. Dr. Petersen reviewed the system-wide strategic plan that UT undertook this year. He noted the hiring of five vice presidents and two chancellors. He also noted six areas of concentration targeted in the strategic plan which are: student access, student success, research, economic development, outreach/globalization, and organization. He then discussed the competition for a new biohazards lab and the proposal between Kentucky and Tennessee which would locate the lab in Somerset, Kentucky. The proposal involves the University of Louisville, the University of Kentucky, University of Tennessee Veterinarian School, and the homeland security school at Oak Ridge National Laboratory.

### Tennessee Student Assistance Corporation

Dr. Robert Ruble was recognized to give his report. Dr. Ruble discussed the lottery scholarship program for the past year. He noted that 56,000 students were served at a cost of \$137 million and that TSAC had received 60,000 applications for the next year totaling \$210 million. He noted the increase in award amount from \$3300 to \$3800 for the basic HOPE scholarship. Dr. Ruble also discussed the loan forgiveness program for nursing students and the math and science teaching loan forgiveness program created by the Legislature this past session.

### Resolutions of Appreciation for Dawn Blackwell and Jim Powell

Dr. Windley recognized Dr. Rhoda to discuss the resolutions. Dr. Rhoda briefly discussed each resolution and highlighted accomplishments by each. After discussion Dr. Windley called for a motion to approve the resolutions. Mr. Jones made a motion to approve the resolutions; General Wendell Gilbert seconded the motion. The motion was duly adopted. Dr. Rhoda announced that the new student member from the Tennessee Board of Regents is Ms. Sondra Wilson, a recent graduate from Columbia State Community College, who will attend a State university. Ms. Wilson was unable to attend the meeting due to prior engagements.

## **Academic Affairs**

### Institute of Public Health Status Report

Dr. Linda Doran was recognized to provide the status report on the Institute of Public Health. She noted Dr. Jo Edwards' appointment as interim director and called on Dr. Edwards to discuss the upcoming events and initiatives. Dr. Edwards briefly discussed the late October conference, planned campus discussions about the value of the Institute, the development of a health needs index, National Network of Institutes of Public Health membership, creation of a work force inventory, research and service inventory, and building the dedicated website for the Institute. She noted the next steps of the Institute were to engage a Board of Directors and campus personnel in the development of a strategic plan to map research and service ambitions and funding acquisition strategies for the next five years. Part of the plan is to seek legislative authorization for the Institute. Dr. Edwards then called on Ms. Lilia Drovnikova to discuss the community health index. Ms. Drovnikova discussed health index rankings and what they determine such as health outcomes, health behaviors, socioeconomic factors, and physical environment to evaluate the state of health in each county.

### Status of Tennessee P-16 Council Mathematics Curricula Alignment

Dr. Doran provided an update on the P-16 Council Mathematics Curricula Alignment Committee and discussed the composition of the committee and its charge. She announced the TBR web link which provides information about local and regional P-16 councils, including contact information and geographic locations, updates on regional and local P-16 councils in the Tennessee P-16 Network, presentations and reports given at the Tennessee P-16 March 21, 2006 meeting, documents for groups desiring to establish local P-16 councils, guides for councils for addressing selected goals or issues as a action team, and links to information on Network meetings and other archived materials. Dr. Doran then discussed the University of Tennessee System events and noted they would be accessible on THEC's P-16 website.

### New Academic Programs

Dr. Linda Bradley, Associate Executive Director for Academic Affairs, presented information on the following 10 new academic programs and units:

Dr. Bradley reviewed the documentation in support of these new programs and highlighted the essential points. Mr. Jack Murrah made a motion to approve the programs as presented. Ms. Katie Winchester seconded the motion, which was duly adopted.

Temporary Authorization of New Institutions, Approval of New Programs Under the Postsecondary Authorization Act, and Recommendations for Appointment to the Postsecondary Education Authorization Committee

Dr. Stephanie Bellard presented the recommendation of staff and the Postsecondary Education Authorization Advisory Committee to grant temporary authorization to proposed new institutions and new programs, respectively. A listing of the institutions and programs are included as attachment A to the official copy of these minutes. She then presented the recommendations for appointment to the Postsecondary Education Authorization Committee, included as attachment B to the official copy of the minutes. A motion was made by Mr. Ransom Jones to adopt the staff recommendation as presented. The motion was seconded by Mr. Adam Green. Dr. Rhoda explained that the advisory committee had reviewed the proposals. Dr. Bellard confirmed and stated that reauthorization is considered on an annual basis and the institutions are required to send information regarding financial statements, faculty, programs, and audit reports. There being no further discussion, Dr. Windley called for a vote on the motion that was duly adopted.

**Policy, Planning and Research**

## GEAR UP Status Report

Dr. Deborah Boyd presented the status report on GEAR UP. She introduced the GEAR UP staff and noted the open house for the GEAR UP offices following the meeting. Dr. Boyd briefly described the program, the nine counties involved in this program, and the amounts allocated for each county, and noted the goals the program aimed to achieve. She then discussed the accomplishments of GEAR UP, which include the statewide program implementation meetings, college access initiatives, and hiring staff in GEAR UP counties. She also discussed upcoming activities, which include statewide implementation, county program implementation, the distribution of Bridge Scholarship funds, campus visits, and program evaluations. An overview of all areas discussed is included as attachment C to the official copy of the minutes.

## **Fiscal Affairs**

### FY 2006-07 Operating Budgets

Mr. Jim Vaden was recognized to present the 2006-07 operating budgets. He briefly discussed the staff analysis tables and noted the budgets for higher education are balanced and expenditures for auxiliary enterprises do not exceed revenues; and all guidelines had been met. Mr. Vaden recommended that the Commission approve the budgets as presented and the Executive Director be given authority to make technical adjustments as necessary until the Commission meets again. The budget recommendations are included as attachment D to the official copy of the minutes. After discussion, Dr. Windley called for a motion to approve the budgets. General Wendell Gilbert made a motion that the Commission approve the FY 2006-07 July 1 operating budgets and authorize the Executive Director to make appropriate technical adjustments if necessary and transmit the original 2006-07 July 1 budgets, along with the appropriate commentary, to the Commissioner of Finance and Administration for their review and approval. Mr. Jones seconded the motion; the motion was duly adopted.

### THEC Audit Committee Charter

Dr. Windley called on Ms. Katie Winchester to present information on the THEC audit committee. Ms. Winchester discussed the pamphlet regarding the responsibilities for reporting fraud, waste, and abuse to the proper authorities, which will be distributed to each THEC employee. She then discussed three new policies: (1) the Code of Conduct for employees which states the expectations of each employee; (2) the Policy on Outside Employment which is necessary to properly document and account for the time an employee performs compensated work for outside activities and to ensure the employee does not conflict with the duties of their employment at the commission; and (3) the Conflict of Interest disclosure policy for Commission staff which extends the disclosure provisions currently required of the THEC Commission members and senior staff to all THEC employees. Dr. Windley called for a motion to

approve the policies as presented. Ms. Winchester made a motion for approval. Mr. Adam Green seconded the motion; the motion was duly adopted.

### **Title VI Implementation Plan Update and Compliance Report**

Dr. Windley recognized Dr. William Arnold to present this report. Dr. Arnold stated that on June 30, Dr. Rhoda submitted the Title VI report to the Comptroller's office. He noted the long range goals and objectives in the Title VI plan including ensuring that successful project grants are achieving optimal utilization specifically, the Improving Teacher Quality grants. Dr. Arnold also noted the plan included ensuring that Commission opportunities and programs that are subject to Title VI are in compliance, such as Veteran's Education under the leadership of Tom Morission, Workforce Investment under the leadership of Dr. Roosevelt Noble, and GEAR UP under the leadership of Dr. Deborah Boyd. He noted that THEC will achieve the stated goals by providing training and re-training of all THEC and TSAC employees and Commission members interested in attending the training sessions for Title VI.

### **Administrative Items**

#### Election of 2006-07 Officers

Dr. Windley called on Ms. Debby Koch to make a report from the ad hoc committee relative to nominations for Commission officers. Ms. Koch recommended that the following slate of officers be elected:

He is a representative of public interest and has no association or relationship to an institution that is subject to the committee's supervision and oversight. Mr. Keys currently serves as Commissioner of the Tennessee Department of Veterans Affairs and was formerly the Director of Veteran Services for Shelby County Government.

3. Reappointment: Mr. Prentis McClain

Mr. Prentis McClain represents west Tennessee. He is a representative that is employed by, holds an ownership in, or is otherwise affiliated with an institution or other entity subject to the committee's supervision and oversight. Mr. McClain serves as the Chief Business Officer on New Dimensions Bible College's Board of Directors.

The staff recommends that Mr. Bill Faour, Commissioner John A. Keys and Mr. Prentis McClain be reappointed to the Committee for a three-year term beginning on July 1, 2006 through June 30, 2009. Other members of the committee are:

## GEAR UP Tennessee Overview

In September 2005, the state of Tennessee was awarded a \$3.5 million federal discretionary grant by the U.S. Department of Education, known as Gaining Early Awareness & Readiness for Undergraduate Programs (GEAR UP). GEAR UP provides resources to assist state efforts to increase the number of low-income students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education. Partnering together in the development and implementation of GEAR UP Tennessee (GEAR UP TN) are the Tennessee Higher Education Commission, Tennessee Department of Education, Tennessee Board of Regents, University of Tennessee System, along with a host of other consultants and local/regional partnerships.

Tennessee's 2005-2010 GEAR UP project will serve an estimated 6,000 students per year in 9 counties and 47 schools. The project is designed to promote student achievement, enhance awareness and expand access to post-secondary education statewide, especially in those areas of the state that are traditionally underserved. GEAR UP TN will provide participating counties with resources to serve an entire cohort of students beginning in the seventh grade and will continue to assist those students through the completion of high school. Concurrently, GEAR UP funds will be used educate high school juniors and seniors and their families on postsecondary opportunities, financial aid, and the benefits of higher education. GEAR UP TN will also provide college scholarships to low-income students in the partnering counties; any graduating high school student will automatically qualify for a GEAR UP TN scholarship of no less than \$750 to be utilized at any regionally accredited, public or private institution located in Tennessee.

Through the creation of early intervention programs, enhanced academic assessments, and a broad-based outreach campaign articulating the importance of postsecondary access, GEAR UP TN aims to achieve the following goals:

- Increase educational expectations of GEAR UP TN students and their families through an expanded knowledge of postsecondary access and financial aid opportunities.
- Enhance the academic preparation of GEAR UP TN students to improve high school graduation rates and postsecondary enrollment, retention, and completion.
- Provide effective professional development for classroom teachers and school staff to ensure increased academic rigor and postsecondary preparation.
- Encourage family and community involvement through GEAR UP TN to foster an environment that supports life-long learning.

GEAR UP TN will serve students in Campbell, Cocke, Grundy, Hardeman, Johnson, Lake, Meigs, Union and Wayne counties.
