Empower Memphis Career and College Prep welcomes students from all over Shelby County but will actively recruit in the Central City West region, particularly in Orange Mound and South Memphis neighborhoods, where 32.8% and 56.4% of residents, respectively, live below the poverty line. Recognizing the historical underperformance of schools in these areas, we anticipate that incoming students may be several grade levels behind their peers.

Please describe the assessment being used. How will data be collected and how frequently is data collected?	 MAP: Northwest Evaluation Association's (NWEA) computerized Measures of Academic Progress (3 times per year-August, December, May) Provides teachers, students, and parents with an accurate assessment of student progress in mastering the basic skills. When administered at regular intervals over time, it is possible to determine whether an individual student or an entire grade level is making satisfactory progress in these basic skill areas. Teachers can use this assessment information for instructional planning for individual students or an entire class. iReady¹: The i-Ready Diagnostic is an adaptive assessment that adjusts its questions to meet the needs of students. Each item a student sees is individualized based on their answer to the previous question. For example, a series of correct answers will result in slightly harder questions, while a series of incorrect answers will yield slightly easier questions. The diagnostic assessment aims to determine how best to support students' learning needs for personalized learning. Illuminate: Interim Assessments will be distributed using Illuminate. Assessments will reflect skills that students have learned over the course of a quarter.
