My name is B. J. Watts, and I am serving my 5th appointment by the Governor of Indiana as a member of the Indiana State Board of Education. As a current educator with over 20 years of teaching experience and 13 years on the State Board, I see the challenges facing public education, particularly in high schools. This problem doesn't belong to Indiana alone; it has become a universal issue, and districts are unsure how to address what seems to have become the norm, and changing the outcomes takes looking beyond what has always been done. I am writing in support of Noble Education Initiative (NEI) and their commitment to do what is necessary to win on behalf of students -even in the most challenging of circumstances.

In 2017-18, during my tenure as chairman of the Indiana State Board of Education, we partnered with NEI to operate and improve academic outcomes at four low-performing schools in Indianapolis: Emmerich Manual High School, Emma Donnan Elementary and Middle, and TC Howe. The implementation of NEI's instructional model and commitment to changing the culture of the school are cornerstones of these success stories. These schools came off the state's failing list and maintained performance, saw some of the highest levels of growth across the district, and became the state's first Cambridge schools.

Much of NE I's success can be attributed to understanding that a principal who is also the instructional leader and teachers who feel valued are non-negotiables in school transformation. In my experience, it takes 3-7 years for schools to transform, but it is work worth doing. I will add that I observed firsthand the impact having high school option had on the middle school students. It kept them engaged and created a real sense of stability and belonging for our students - something that isn't always easy to accomplish.

Over the years of observing the work NEI has led in Indiana schools, I continue to be impressed with their commitment to doing what is right for students -with high expectations and accountability with groups of students that are behind academically and face other challenges including poverty and academic deficiencies. If given the opportunity to work with NEI again, I would - knowing they have done the hard work academically and operationally and know what it takes to produce outcomes for students. You can trust their word and their work. They will deliver.

My name is Dr. Tony Bennett, and I am the former state superintendent for the state of Indiana. I felt compelled to reach out to share additional context as well as my personal experience with Noble Education Initiative (NEI) and their work with failing schools in Indiana.

NEI was charged with turning around Emmerich Manual High School, Emma Donnan Elementary, Emma Donnan Middle School and TC Howe Community High School (grades 7-12) all of which were some of the lowest performing schools in Indianapolis. While I cannot speak to the specifics of NEI's current amendment, I can speak to what they have accomplished and can accomplish when given time to grow and fully implement their instructional and operational model.

NEI worked to build a culture of high expectations not just for students but also for its teachers. This involved addressing the rigor of instruction to meet state standards. Particularly in persistently failing schools, changing the culture in the building takes time, and it begins with the administrators and teachers. They also recognized the needs of the community and aligned that need with career pathways, real opportunities that were previously not available to our students.

What I know for sure is that turning around a school made up of students that are challenged with poverty, language barriers, or other adverse experiences takes time. At a minimum, seeing results takes three years, but research indicates that sustainable turnaround can take 5-7 years. These schools did not fail overnight, and resurgence cannot happen overnight. But it did happen, thanks to the commitment of the Noble Education team and the academic and operational leadership over time. What I appreciated about NEI was their unwavering commitment to student success. They did not give up and never let us down - no matter how dark it seemed at times. Manual High School went from the state's failing school list to earning and maintaining a letter grade of C for three consecutive years. This growth changed the lives of its students, and I remain grateful for their steadfastness in leading schools others had given up on.

From a state chief who witnessed the work firsthand, I can say that Noble has an effective educational model, a plan for changing the school culture, and a commitment to students above all else. They are partners who do what they say and remain focused on delivering on behalf of students. This work is hard, and it just takes time for systemic change to occur.

In a nutshell, let me tell you how my experience has been...

From the moment that I first entered the NCP building till the moment that I am currently writing this letter to you; I have received nothing but unrelenting support and love from my fellow teachers and administration. It felt as if I had gained a whole new family and home. Thanks to our community model, we have a level of communication and a system of support between us that I have not experienced anywhere else. We have each other's backs, as family members do. And, as the youngest of our family, it certainly feels great knowing that I have an excellent team of kind, caring, and determined educators supporting me.

However, the support that this model has given me is nothing compared to what it has done for our students. As you may know, many of our students come to our school below their expected grade level. Our goal is to help them reach proficiency through a variety of data-proven strategies. Since the start of our school year, I have witnessed our students grow leaps and bounds, not just in their academic skills, but also in their development as young men and women.

This school year has been a great learning experience for our students so far. Yet, despite their success this year, it is important to think about their future. Currently, it is decided that these students will be attending larger public schools within the next few years. Hello. My name is Elizabeth Sims, and I am a fifth-grade teacher at Nashville Collegiate Prep. This is my second-year teaching, and I am very excited to be back at NCP for another year. I am writing to share a little bit about why I support NCP and its goal of obtaining the high school expansion.

A unique feature of NCP is the community model structure. This model allows us to work with students in small group settings for intervention based on their data. Small groups are where I have seen the most student growth stem from. Because we have protected small group time, teachers can focus more on individual needs and areas of growth. When students are not in a small group, they are working individually on their technology (iReady or Lexia) that is leveled to their needs. Therefore, we are able to track our students' proficiency using multiple real-time data points and immediately implement the results of their data in our teaching. The repetition of this pattern within our community model is part of what makes NCP so successful. Furthermore, the success of this model is possible because of the smaller class and school size.

We have continued elements of this model into our middle school, and we are seeing the same levels of growth. Our middle school is currently undergoing construction, and we are so excited to transition into that building. The high school would be an excellent next step.

Having a high school will lead to better facilities that will support academic growth and support for the whole child. The ability to have a campus that includes science lab classrooms, a gymnasium, continued technology access, and more will allow our students to thrive! The students who are at this school are part of the community. The stability and consistency of this model, this school, continuing all the way up to 12th grade would have long-term benefits. They instruction model, one-to-one technology, extracurriculars, and data-driven decision making would follow them. I am urgently writing as a member of this community, as a parent, and as a teacher to support the expansion of an NCP High School.

NCP is a special school. I know you probably hear that from all of the schools, but in this case, it is true. I have worked in public schools, and in other charter schools and NCP has by far been the best environment for students and for teachers. NCP is what our community needs.

NCP offers a smaller learning environment, which allows for a more intimate and focused learning environment for our students. English and Math are both 90-block classes where students receive 30 minutes of whole-class instruction, 40 minutes of small-group instruction through academically enriching and engaging rotations, and 20 minutes of one-to-one technology time in which our students log into programs such as iReady and Lexia that provide direct learning activities meeting a student's individual needs at their own academic level. This means that in one of our school days, our students are being exposed to and learning academic grade level content, as well as being met at their current tested academic level, whether that is a lower grade or higher grade, our students are constantly being pushed academically. I am planning 12 small group lessons a week, each different based on assessment data from weekly tests. I also plan 4 enrichment groups a week that meet before and after school. This program is to continue the growth of our higher level students we have 6th graders reading 7th and 8th grade materials, and working on higher grade level standards. Our school offers tutoring before and after school as well so that we don't leave any of our children behind. I know every face and name in the middle school building.

Our students know they matter to the entire NCP team, and that is not something to take lightly, especially at a time when teen suicide is the third-highest cause of death. Our students need to be nurtured not only academically, but emotionally as well. Students who feel safe and loved in their learning environment are more likely to be successful academically, and NCP provides that safe environment.

Expanding to an NCP high school would give students in our community an opportunity to continue their education at a smaller-scale high school, which would accommodate 600 students, instead of the standard 2000 students. My graduating high school class was larger than 600 students. I fear our children will get lost among the thousands in another school, especially our current students who would have come from smaller classrooms, but if we had an NCP High School our students would be provided with invaluable benefits.

A smaller school environment fosters a sense of community which allows for more personalized attention, stronger teacher-student relationships, stronger teacher-parent relationships, and a greater sense of belonging. As a parent, I recognize the significance of these factors in shaping our child's academic journey and overall well-being.

You may argue why NCP and not one of the other capable charters around the Nashville area. I respond with that smaller school environment. Charters in the area hope to foster a smaller school environment, as we currently do for our K-8 grade students. There are simply not enough schools to accommodate for smaller class settings.

Myself and NCP firmly believes that a smaller school setting facilitates a more holistic approach to education. It promotes inclusivity, active participation, and a greater sense of accountability among students, fostering an environment conducive to academic success and personal growth.

We are special among the charter schools because we teach in a community model. This means students and teachers work together in an open learning environment. Students here learn to make smart decisions and take control of their learning own learning. This way of learning has been proven in our academic data. This is proven in my own data, out of 89 students tested in ELA, I have a 105% growth rate, in our first big iReady Reading benchmark. Imagine our students allowed to continue their learning growth into their high school years as well.

Our community model learning makes it so there is a smooth transition from K-5 to 6-8th grades. Our children deserve a smooth and consistent transition into their high school journey. NCPHS provides the opportunity for our children to continue their educational journey within a familiar and supportive environment. I cannot think of one person who would not want that for their children.

The continuity in the learning philosophy, values, and educational standards from the existing school to the new high school is invaluable. This transition would not only ensure a seamless shift but also allow our children to thrive academically and socially in a setting that aligns with their previous experiences.?
