OCTOBER 19, 2023 MEETING MINUTES REGISTRY OF ELECTION FINANCE

The Registry of Election Finance ("the Registry" or "the Board") of the Bureau of Ethics and Campaign Finance ("the Bureau") met at 9:30 AM on Thursday, October 19, 2023 in the Tennessee Room 2 of the WR Snodgrass Tennessee Tower, 312 Rosa L. Parks Ave., Nashville. TN 37243.

Presiding over the meeting was Vice Chairman Hank Fincher. Attending the meeting were Board Members Tom Lawless, Paige Burcham-Dennis, David Golden, and Paz Haynes. Executive Director Bill Young, Assistant Director Lance Frizzell, General Counsel Lauren Topping, Chief of Staff Janet Williams and Director of Audit Jay Moeck also were in attendance. The meeting was open to the public. This meeting was recorded via video and audio recording.

Director Young opened the meeting by noting that a physical quorum of the Registry members was present.

At the outset of the meeting, Member Lawless moved to suspend the usual rules to allow the Registry to proceed out of order so that those present in the room with matters before the Registry could be heard first. Member Golden seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved. Nonetheless, the minutes will reflect the matters in the order they were placed on the Registry's published agenda.

Approval of Meeting Minutes

Member Lawless moved to approve the meeting minutes of the Registry's previous August 17, 2023, meeting as presented. Member Golden seconded the motion, which was unanimously approved by voice vote (5-0).

Update of Humble Audit

Director Young advised the Registry members that the Staff was not yet prepared to address this matter, but that it would be on the Registry's next meeting agenda. No action was taken.

Show Cause Hearings

Hamilton County Fund for Children & Public Educ., Case No. 23-78 (Appointment of Treasurer); Hamilton County Fund for Children & Public Educ. (Annual Mid-Year

<u>Supplemental</u>): Attorney Rick Colbert appeared on behalf of the organization and addressed the Registry members. At the outset of this discussion, Counsel waived additional notice concerning the Annual Mid-Year Supplemental report in order to consolidate these matters and resolve both matters together. Counsel presented a statement to the Registry members. After a discussion, Member Lawless moved to assess a total civil penalty of \$250. Member Dennis seconded the motion. However, the motion failed (3-2). After additional discussion, Member Lawless renewed his motion, which was again seconded by Member Dennis; however, the motion again failed. Member Lawless then moved to roll further consideration of these matters to the Registry's next scheduled meeting. The motion was seconded by Member Dennis and approved.

<u>Legacy PAC, Case No. 23-82</u>: Andre Dean appeared on behalf of the PAC and presented a statement to the Registry. After a discussion, Member Lawless moved to assess a civil penalty of \$250. Member Dennis seconded the motion, which was approved by roll call vote (4-1, Member Haynes opposed).
