2022 Population Estimates

About the Estimates

The Census Bureau's Population Estimates Program (PEP) produces estimates of the population for the United States, its states, counties, cities, and towns, as well as for the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico. Demographic components of population change (births, deaths, and migration) are produced at the national, state, and county levels of geography.

PEP utilizes current data on births, deaths, and migration to calculate population change since the most recent decennial census and produce a time series of estimates of population, demographic components of change, and housing units. The annual time series of estimates begins with the most recent decennial census data and extends to the vintage year.

State Population

Tennessee's population increased 82,988 residents from 2021 to 2022. With the increase, Tennessee becomes the 15th most populous state in the nation, up from 16th in 2021. The nearly 83,000 new residents represented the seventh highest increase in absolute terms and the eleventh largest percentage increase. Texas saw the largest increase at over 470,000 residents. Florida was second and had the largest percent increase at 3.3 percent.

Across the U.S., 18 states experienced population declines in 2022. New York saw the largest decline in absolute and percentage terms losing 180,341 residents, or 0.9 percent. California was the most populous state while Wyoming was the least populous.

Tennessee saw a natural decrease in population as there were 9,000 more deaths than births, however a net migration of

nearly 90,000 people to Tennessee drove the population increase. International migration accounted for just over 8,000 additional residents.

County Population

Across Tennessee's counties, Rutherford saw the largest population increase at over 9,000 additional residents followed by Knox and Montgomery counties, each adding over 7,000 residents. Wilson County had the next highest increase with 6,545 new residents, which was the highest relative increase at 4.3 percent. Trousdale County had a 4.2 percent increase, good for the second highest.

Among the twelve counties with a population decrease, Shelby County had the largest population decline losing nearly 7,000 residents. Sevier County was a distant second with a loss of 646 residents. Lake County had the greatest decline in relative terms with a 1.4 percent population decrease. Lake County is the third least populous county in the state with 6,507 residents. Pickett and Van Buren counties are the least populous with populations of 5,107 and 6,429, respectively.

Despite the decline in Shelby County, it is still the most populous county in the state with over 900,000 residents. Davidson, Knox, Hamilton, and Rutherford round out the five most populous counties, all with populations exceeding 300,000. Williamson, Montgomery, and Sumner are the only other counties with over 200,000 residents. These eight counties represent just over half the state's population at 50.4 percent.

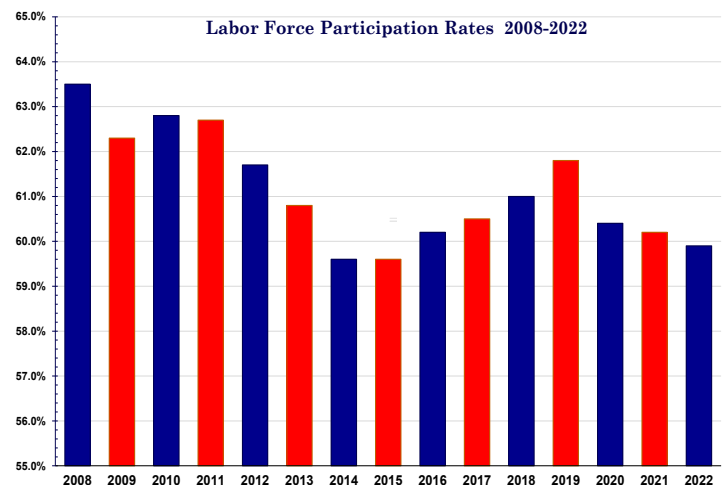

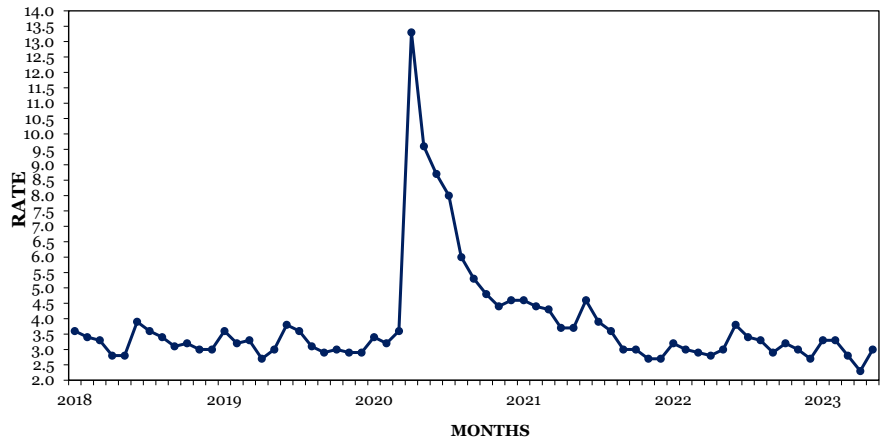

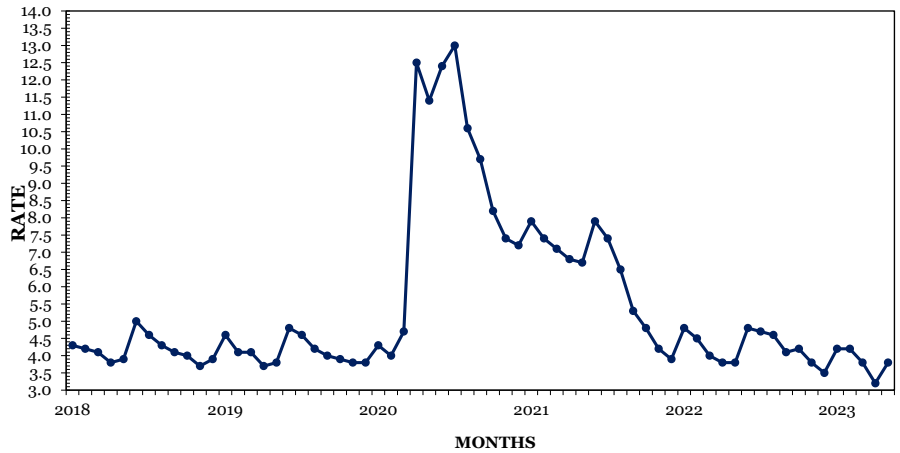

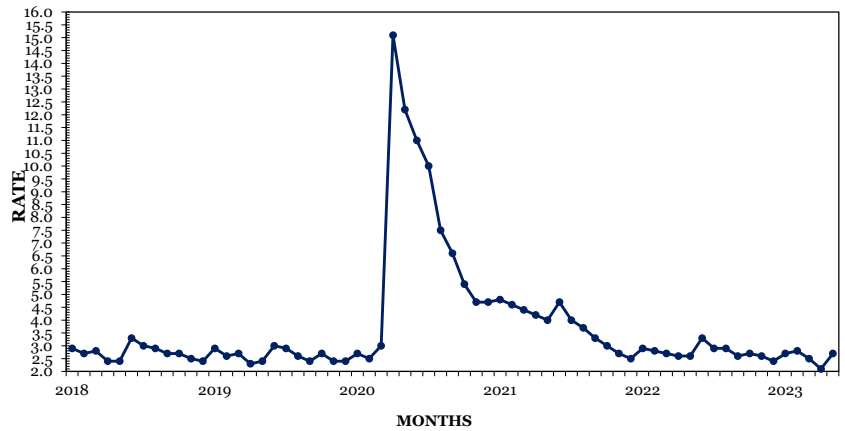

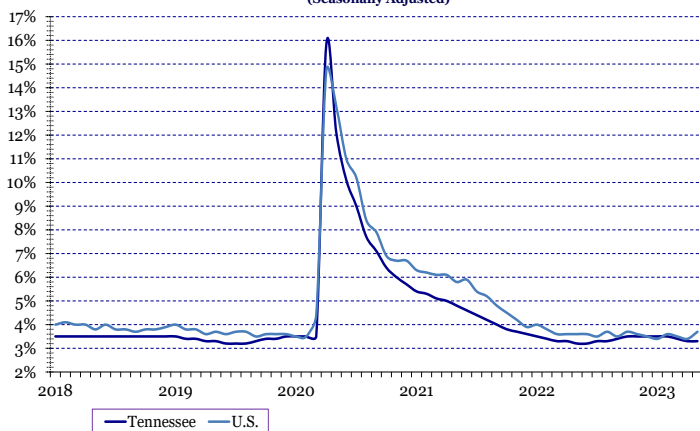
